Additional Background Information (If Needed):

The purpose of this project is to survey the adult population in Macomb County (1,200 individuals) on various behaviors, medical conditions, and preventive health care practices. Findings from the survey are useful to MCHD, the hospital systems, and community partners in identifying priority health issues and the populations at greatest risk for health problems. The data contribute to planning efforts and effective targeting of resources to support intervention programs, and can be used by all community members to gain a better understanding of the health concerns affecting our community. The Health Department has conducted the Behavioral Risk Factor Survey in 2009, 2005 and 2002, based on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's survey methodology and instrument and contracted with the Southeastern Michigan Health Association to coordinate and implement these surveys and reports.

Official Resolution of the Board of Commissioners

Macomb County, Michigan

Resolution Supporting Michigan Senate Bill 524 and House Bill 4909
To Stop The Use Of The "Dark Stores" Approach And
Eliminate Unfair Tax Advantages For "Big Box" Retailers

Commissioners Veronica Klinefelt, Steve Marino, Kathy Vosburg, and Dave Flynn, On Behalf Of The Macomb County Board of Commissioners Offer the Following Resolution:

WHEREAS, Michigan has three accepted methods of determining a property's "true cash value," or fair market value: (1) *Sales Approach* – comparable sales, (2) *Cost Approach* – the cost of construction less depreciation, and (3) *Income Approach* – how much income a property produces; and

WHEREAS, in the past, Michigan has determined a property's "true cash value," or fair market value, via the "cost approach"; and

WHEREAS, recently, large ("Big Box") retailers have convinced the Michigan Tax Tribunal (MTT) and the State Court to rely on the "sales approach" to determine a property's "true cash value," which relies on sales comparisons to vacant, or dark properties, also called the "Dark Stores" approach; and

WHEREAS, these vacant, or dark properties are usually owned by the same "big box" retailers who refuse to sell their vacant structures to other retailers, some of which have even imposed deed restrictions to block their use for retailing, so that assessors are forced to compare sales of vacant structures to existing "big box" stores; and

WHEREAS, these "Big Box" retailers have used the "Dark Stores" approach to repeal local property tax assessments by way of the MTT and distort the valuation process and shifted more of the burden to fund local public services to small businesses and homeowners; and

WHEREAS, these vacant structures maintained through deed restrictions also contribute to blight in our communities; and

WHEREAS, according to the 2015 Michigan Association of County Treasurers survey, since 2013, local municipalities refunded almost \$75 million to "Big Box" retailers as a result of the MTT's decisions; and

WHEREAS, according to the Michigan Association of Counties, a study of property taxes in Oakland County showed on average "Big Box" retailers paying fifty percent less than their smaller competitors, and the median property tax rate for smaller retailers is 72 percent above the median property tax rate for "Big Box" retailers; and

WHEREAS, Michigan Senate Bill 524 and House Bill 4909 hopes to address the tax minimization strategy used by national "Big Box" retailers by preventing the use of anti-competitive deed restrictions that distort the market, and by requiring that assessors and taxpayers use all three assessment approaches (cost, sales and income) based on the particular circumstances so that "Big Box" retailers be valued and taxed in the same manner as any other Michigan storefront business and like any other taxpayer.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Macomb County Board of Commissioners supports the Michigan Senate Bill 524 and House Bill 4909 to stop the use of the "Dark Stores" approach to property tax assessments and eliminate unfair tax advantages for "Big Box" Retailers.
