RESOLUTION No. 279. - Re: REQUEST FOR MORE

MONEY FOR MAINTENANCE OF COUNTY ROADS

WHEREAS, under the McNitt Bill, so-called, the several counties of the State have been and are obligated to take over and maintain the township roads; and

used

WHEREAS, such roads are under extensively by school buses, milk trucks and other public convenience vehicles the year around; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the funds allocated by the MeNitt Bill for the purpose of maintaining such roads are utterly inadequate for such purpose; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the cities and villages of the State are receiving no assistance from the State in connection with the maintenance of their streets: and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of Supervisors of Macomb County, that the several cities and villages are entitled to a like measure of relief as are the several townships in the matter e-of maintenance of highways; and

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board that the funds allocated under the McNitt Bill are not sufficient to properly maintain said roads:

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Macomb County, that the Governor and the Legislature, at its next regular or special session, be requested to provide more money for the maintenance of Committy Roads taken over under the McNitt Act and Gity and village streets and to allocate such money fairly as between said townships, cities and villages.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that it is the opinion of this Board that one-half of the money derived from the sales tax on automobiles, autoparts and accessories, and one-half of the money derived from the 3% advalorem sales tax on gas and oil, would be an amount sufficient to provide such relief.

THEREFORE, we do request that such funds be allocated to the upkeep of county roads taken over under the McNitt Act and City and Village streets.

The Clerk announced a quorum present and the meeting proceeded to transact business.

Upon request of the Chairman, memorandum of agreement between the County of Macomb and contractors on the new County Building, was read by the Clerk and is as follows:

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made this 7th day of February, A. D., 1933, by and between the County of Macomb, a municipal corporation of the State of Michigan, party of the first part, and the Otto Misch Company, a Michigan Corporation, of the City of Detroit, Michigan, Otis Elevator Company, a corporation, Gray Electric Company, Inc., a corporation, and the Macomb County Trust Company and Loretta Hatzenbuhler, co-administrators of the Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler, deceased, as parties of the second part;

WHEREAS, the Otto Misch Company was general contractor and Fred J. Hatzenbuhler, Otis Elevator Company, and the Gray Electric Company, Inc., were the mechanical trades contractors for the construction and erection of a county building and court house in the City of Mount Clemens and County of Macomb and have general contracts with the County of Macomb for the construction and erection of said County Building and Court House, the date of the said contracts being: Otto Misch Company, the 13th day of March, 1931, Fred J. Hatzenbuhler the 13th day of March 1931, Otis Elevator Company the 13th day of March, 1931, and Gray Electric Company, Inc., the 13th day of March, 1931.

AND WHEREAS, due to a general business depression existing throughout these United States wherein the collection of taxes has greatly decreased, the said County of Macomb was unable to perform its part of the various contracts described above with the parties of the second part and defaulted in the payment of moneys due said parties of the second part and as a result thereof all work ceased on or about the 15th day of October, 1931;

AND WHEREAS the parties hereto are desirous of adjusting and settling, as near as may be, the matters of difference between them arising out of the said contracts and avoiding litigation on claims filed, and that it is the desire and purport of this agreement that the parties of the second part be released of their obligation under their contracts to construct said County Building, and that the County of Macomb is desirous on its part of being released of the obligation of its contract from the payment of moneys due to the parties of the second part thereunder for those parts of said contracts as yet unperformed;

AND WHEREAS it is the desire and purport of this agreement that of a sum of money of approximately Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) now available that Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) of said fund be distributed, divided and paid to the parties of the second part according to this agreement as hereinafter set forth, and that

the remaining Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) of this money may be free from all claims on the part of the parties of the second part and that said sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) shall be available to the use of the Building Committee of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Macomb to complete the construction of the said County Building as far as may be and the said second parties directly agree not to interfere by means of litigation or otherwise with the use of said fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) by the Building Committee as aforesaid;

IT IS, THEREFORE, MUTUALLY AGREED by and between the parties hereto that each of them be relieved of all responsibility to the other party arising out of the aforesaid building contracts upon the execution of this agreement by every one of the parties hereto but no sooner.

IT IS FURTHER MUTUALLY AGREED that there is now due from the County of Macomb to the Otto Misch Company at this time under said contract the sum of Seventy-seven thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Six Dollars and Sixty-five cents (\$77,786.65) and that there is further due an additional estimated amount of Thirty-two Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars and Sixty-two cents (\$32,438,62) now due to the said Otto Misch Company from the County of Macomb for materials on hand either delivered at said building or in the shops and warehouses of the Otto Misch Company or its sub-contractors, which second sum includes labor performed, not certified, and the rental of a certain hoist. It is further agreed that said sum of Thirty-two thousand four hundred thirty-eight dollars and sixty-two cents (\$32,438.62) is subject to alteration on inspection and inventory being taken by the County of Macomb, its agents, servants or employees, and that said amount is subject to correction by reduction in the event said inventory determines a lesser amount is due but that said amount may not be increased.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that there is now due the sum of Fourteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-three Dollars and Seventy-one cents (\$14,263.71) due to the Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler, deceased, for work done on said County Building and materials furnished therefor by the said Fred J. Hatzenbuhler during his lifetime. It is further agreed that said Estate now has on hand certain materials and equipment per attached list especially made for said County Building which the County of Macomb agrees to buy from the said Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler in the amount of Six Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty Dollars and Fifty-nine cents (\$6,920.59) and to pay for according to the terms of the agreement hereinafter set forth. It is further agreed that the engagement of this contract is subject to the approval of the Probate Court for the County of Macomb wherein said Estate is now being probated.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BETWEEN the parties hereto that the County of Macomb is indebted to the Otis Elevator Company in the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred and Thirty-two Dollars (\$3,232.00) for materials furnished and work done in said County Building and that the said Otis Elevator Company has on hand certain equipment and materials made especially for said County Building in an amount which will make the total indebtedness due from the County of Macomb the sum of Seven Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty-two Dollars (\$7,652.00) which amount shall be paid as hereinafter set forth.

IT IS FURTHER MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED between the parties hereto that the County of Macomb is indebted to the Gray Electric Company, Inc. in the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-two Dollars and Forty-six cents (\$1,392.46) for materials furnished and work done on the Macomb County Court House by the said Gray Electric Company, Inc., and that there is certain material and work to be furnished said County of Macomb by the Gray Electric Company, Inc., in the sum of Six Hundred Forty-five Dollars and Ninety-six cents (\$645.96), which sum shall be paid in accordance with the agreement hereinafter set forth.

It is the purport and agreement of the parties hereto that all the additional amounts hereinbefore referred to describe materials which the said parties of the second part have fabricated or constructed especially for said County Building, which said second parties had on hand at the cessation of construction and that the total payment therefor is in full for future damages and is the determination of the same.

On the signing and delivering of this agreement and contract the County of Macomb shall pay to the Otto Misch Company the Sum of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) to apply on the indebtedness now due the said Otto Misch Company from the County of Macomb and that the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) shall be paid to the Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler, Otis Elevator Company, and Gray Electric Company, Inc., pro rata according to the amounts due said parties at this time, which are: Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler, Fourteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-three Dollars and Seventeen cents (\$14,263.17); Otis Elevator Company, Three Thousand Two Hundred thirty-two dollars (\$3,232.00); and Gray Electric Company, Inc., One Thousand Three Hundred ninety-two Dollars and forty-six cents (\$1,392.46),

The County of Macomb agrees that all funds and moneys which it receives and collects by reason of the delinquent one mill tax levied for the purpose of constructing said Court House shall be applied and used for the purpose of paying the balance due the parties of the second part hereto and that such a payment shall be made quarterly of all the delinquent taxes collected from said one mill tax levy and shall be paid to the parties of the second part hereto in pro rata share according to the indebtedness then due the said parties of the second part until the parties of the second part are paid in full. It is further understood that the parties of the second part shall receive their pro rata share of such collection according to the balance due them from the County of Macomb after the payment of the said Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00).

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that all moneys in closed banks consisting of the prior collection of the said one mill tax shall be pro rated, when collected, between the parties of the second part according to the balance due said second parties from the party of the first part.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the party of the first part shall pay the parties of the second part simple interest at the rate of three per cent per annum (3%) on the amounts due said second parties after the execution of this agreement, except that in the event the State of Michigan declares a moratorium on the interest due on taxes, including the delinquent one mill tax, then all interest shall be waived by the parties of the second part in the amount and for the term of such interest moratorium.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that this agreement shall be paid in full by the party of the first part within five (5) years from the date of the execution hereof.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the parties of the second part may assign any or all parts of the indebtedness due them under this agreement and the party of the first part agrees to accept and be bound by any such assignments and pay any such assignees according to the terms hereof.

Brewer moved and Rosso seconded that the Building Committee present a statement showing how much work could be done toward the completion of the County Building, with \$15,000.00.

Motion carried.

Foss moved and Hægen seconded that the Bond of Don Mulholland, Circuit Court Commissioner, be approved and referred to the Finance Committee for payment.

Motion carried.

Messmore moved and Riesterer seconded that the following proposed resolution offered by Prosecuting Attorney, McKinstry, concerning the appointment of one investigator for the Prosecutor's Office, be referred to the Resolution Committee.

"WHEREAS, it appears that many investigations are carried on directly under the supervision of the office of the Prosecuting Attorney, and

WHEREAS, it has been the practice to employ private investigators for that office from time to time, and

WHEREAS, it is present practice for the Prosecutor to call the office of the sheriff for such investigator as desired, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of economy and responsibility,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the appointment of one investigator be allowed the Prosecutor, of equal rank, authority and rating with the plain clothes officers employed by the sheriff, such investigator to be responsible to the Prosecutor first, and available to the sheriff when not assigned work by the Prosecutor, and that the budget be corrected accordingly, but not increased."

D., 1933, by and between the COUNTY OF MACOMB, a Michigan Municipal Corporation, of the First Part, OTTO MISCH COMPANY, a Michigan Corporation, of the Second Part, GRAY ELECTRIC COMPANY, INC., a Corporation, of the Third Part, MACOMB COUNTY TRUST COMPANY and LORETTA HATZENBUHLER, Administrators of the Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler, deceased, of the Fourth Part, and OTIS ELEVATOR COMPANY, a corporation, of the Fifth Part.

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have simultaneously with the execution of this agreement executed a certain other agreement hereinafter referred to as the main agreement, relating to the termination of the building contracts heretofore entered into between the First Party, of the one part, and the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Parties, of the other part, and relating to the distribution of certain moneys on hand in the possession of the First Party among the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Parties, and the setting aside of certain other moneys toward the completion of a portion of the new Macomb County Building at Mount Clemens, Michigan, all of which will more particularly appear from the said main agreement, reference to which is hereby made and which is by reference made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the First Party to complete a portion of the said County Building consisting of the lower four floors of the said building, to such an extent as to render the said first four floors fit for occupation and use, for which said purpose the said First Party has reserved the sum of \$15,000.00 as in the said main agreement provided; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to the completion of the said first four floors that the Fifth Party hereto complete the entire installation of the elevator equipment in the said building and it is the desire and intention of the First Party hereto that the said Fifth Party should so complete the installation of the said elevator equipment in accordance with the plans and specifications for the said building; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of all the parties hereto to guarantee and secure to the said Fifth Party the actual payment in cash to it, the said Fifth Party, on the completion of the elevator installation, of the sum of \$4,000.00.

NOW THEREFORE, THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH that in consideration of the premises and in consideration of the execution of the said agreement executed simultaneously herewith, the parties hereto covenant and agree together as follows:

- 1. THE First Party agrees that it will out of the said sum of \$15,000.00 reserved as aforesaid, set aside in the form of a certified cheque, for deposit in an escrow account with a depository acceptable to the Fifth Party, the sum of \$1,456.00 in cash for payment to the Fifth Party forthwith after the completion of the installation of the said elevator equipment.
- 2. THE Second Party agrees that simultaneously with the payment to it of the sum of \$35,000.00 asprovided in the said main agreement, it will deliver its certified cheque in the amount of \$1,978.67 for deposit in the aforesaid escrow account.
- 3. Similarly, simultaneously with the payment to the Estate of Fred J. Hatzenbuhler and to the Gray Electric Company Inc., and to Otis Elevator Company, of their pro rata share of the sum of \$10,000.00 to be paid under and in accordance with the terms of the said main agreement, the said last named parties shall deliver certified cheques for deposit in the aforesaid escrow account in the following amounts:

which said last mentioned sums, together with a certified cheque to be delivered by the Otto Misch Company, and the sum of \$1456.00 to be set aside and delivered by the County of Macomb, will make up the full sum of \$4,000.00.

- 4. IT is further agreed that the said sum of \$4,000.00 shall be deposited in escrow in a depository in the City of Detroit acceptable to the Fifth Party under the terms of an escrow agreement under which the depository as Escrowee shall be authorized and directed to pay the said full sum of \$4,000.00 to Otis Elevator Company forthwith upon the completion of the installation of the elevator equipment in the said new Macomb County Building.
- \$4,000.00 in escrow as above provided, the said Otis Elevator Company shall stand ready and willing at all times at the request of the County of Macomb to proceed with and complete the fabrication and installation of the elevator equipment to be installed in the said New Macomb County Building, in accordance with the plans and specifications of the building. Provided, however, that the said Otis Elevator Company shall not be construed to be under any obligation to proceed to any extent whatsoever with the fabrication or furnishing of further materials for the said elevator installation or for the furnishing of labor or services or for proceeding with or completing the installation of the said elevator equipment, until the full sum of \$4,000.00 has been deposited in escrow as above provided.
- 6. Upon the completion of the installation of the said elevator equipment, the Otis Elevator Company shall be entitled also to receive in addition to the said sum of \$4,000.00 as above provided, the sum of \$420.00, being the balance of the contract price over and above all amounts mentioned in the said main agreement, and the said sum of \$4,000.00 above provided, for, provided however, that said last mentioned sum of \$420.00 shall be paid to and accepted by the said Otis Elevator Company from the delinquent tax fund and the moneys on deposit in closed banks referred to in the agreement executed simultaneously hereto in the same manner and to the same extent as if the said Otis Elevator Company is entitled to receive the balance of the sum of \$3,232.00, as provided in said main agreement.
- 7. IT is understood and agreed that the amounts which the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Parties are contributing to or for Otis Elevator Company from the amount of the cash to be paid to them

AND WHEREAS, a further resolution was adopted on 1/23/32 providing for a further extention of a part of said notes.

AND WHEREAS, in accordance with said agreements Note No. 5, has been fully paid and \$50,000 has been paid on the principal of the remaining notes and a part of the interest on said notes has been paid, leaving unpaid as of October 1, 1932, \$250,000 principal and \$7,500 past due interest,

AND WHEREAS, said bank is willing to grant a further extension of said notes,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and instructed to pay on February 1, 1932, all interest due to that date on said notes and to pay on or before April 1, 1933, not less than \$20,000 on the principal of said notes and on or before July 1, 1933 an additional \$55,000 on principal of said notes.

RESOLVED FURTHER that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and instructed to pay interest on the unpaid balance of said notes quarterly on May 1st, August 1st, and November 1st, 1933

RESOLVED FURTHER that at the October session of 1933 this board shall include in the county tax levy for the year 1934 an amount equal to the balance then remaining unpaid on said notes, with interest thereon, and that the balance of said notes be paid out of the taxes for the year 1934 as fast as possible and not later than April 1st, 1934."

To the Hon. Chairman and members of the Board:

Acting on the motion passed by the Board at the special session held April 21, 1933, the Welfare Committee went to Lansing and saw Mr. James Sinke, Executive Officer of the State Unemployment Commission in an endeavor to clear up several points contained in his letter of April 12, 1933 to the County Clerk.

In presenting our findings to the Board, we think it advisable to include the following:

EXTRACT FROM R.F.C. RESOLUTION DATED APRIL 7, 1933 There are many practical difficulties involved in the multiplicity of individual applications for small independent political subdivisions within the various counties as they have been filed by the State of Michigan to date. This recommendation is made with the understanding that such coordination and cooperation in relief activities will be developed within the respective counties so that any further applications for Federal relief funds will present the needs and the factual information upon a county-wide basis.

In order that townships and cities under twenty thousand may remeive R.F.C. aid, it is necessary that counties on the township and
city plan of relief, assume the responsibility for receiving and
accounting for these funds and for such obligations for repaying the
State, as same may require, said obligation in turn may be required
by the County from its subdivisions.

You will note that neither the Reconstruction Finance Corporation's Resolution, nor the Governor's letter to Mr. Carpenter, mentions anything about making Counties' responsible for future loans, but Mr. Sinke's letter does. Mr. Sinke stated that in a leter telephone conversation with the Governor, that he was told it is the intent of the administration to make Counties responsible for all loans to their political sub-divisions.

Regarding the question as to what security would be required from the Counties, Mr. Sinke was unable to say what the requirements would be, and referred the Committee to Assistant Attorney General Young. Mr. Young's office reported that he was not in Lansing and would not return until Monday, April 24th.

The Committee also called at the office of the R.F.C. and their representatives were unable to furnish any definite information on the questions in doubt. However, they did recommend that we file our applications without further delay and ruled that the County did not obligate itself by the filing of applications.

Mr. Wiegand stated, at this time, that according to Mr. Sinke's statement, the County had no choice in the matter and that the Townships are to make separate applications for R. F. C. Welfare aid, which the State will consolidate and this will be a County obligation.

The following is a detail report of the Department Budget as proposed:

To the Chairman and Members of the Macomb County Board of Supervisors:

Your Budget Committee is submitting herewith a proposed budget for the year 1934. In preparing this budget your committee has interviewed the heads of the various County departments in a conscientious endeavor to reduce the cost of county government to its lowest possible figure. We have made comparisons with the operating cost for the past three years, and the schedules, as set up in the budget, are the amounts actually required for twelve months of operating.

The only flexibility in the budget is the amount classified as unbudgeted item.

You can readily see that in the event of 50% tax collection this budget will only permit six months operation, there being no reserve set up for delinquency;

The total rate for operating cost and debt service for 1934 is \$6.44 per \$1,000.00 valuation. This compares with the total rate of \$7.88 for 1933 or a reduction of \$1.44 per \$1,000 valuation in the tax rate.
