The Clerk announced a quorum present and the meeting proceeded to transact business.

Due to the fact that Mr. McKinstry, the Prosecuting Attorney, was ill, Mr. Fitzgerald, the Assistant Prosecutor, appeared before the Board to answer any questions regarding the County Clerk's office.

With reference to the shortage mentioned in the report, Mr. Fitzgerald said it was his impression that Mr. Erskine had been served with an Order to Show Cause and all provisions of the statute covering this action had been carried out. This procedure, he believed, was at the suggestion of the Circuit Judges. The Order to Show Cause will come up for hearing next Monday and if not properly answered, the Judge can institute criminal proceedings.

Nunneley moved and Kern seconded that the Auditor General's Report be received and filed with the County Clerk and recommendations referred to the Finance Committee with instructions that all County Officials comply with the recommendations contained therein and that each Department be furnished with a copy of the findings referring to that particular Department.

Macomb County Sheriff, George T. Smith, appeared before the Board with reference to the decrease in deputies in his office. He pointed out that he thought with proper co-operation, there would be enough papers served, the income from which would enable him to take care of the payment of the three extra deputies.

Sherbeck moved and Messmore seconded that the request of the Sheriff, Mr. Smith, be referred to the Budget and Finance Committee and to report back to the Board. Motion carried.

The Bonds of various County Officials were read.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEES  
TO THE

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors:

Your Budget and Finance Committees met in joint session on December 21, 1934, to go over the budget of the Register of Deeds office according to the instructions of this Board with power to act.

Accordingly the following action was taken.

A motion was made by Warren, seconded by Sherbeck, that the Deputy Register of Deeds be paid \$1,300 per year, and that an allowance be made for three clerks to receive \$75.00 per month or \$900.00 per year each, making a total of \$2,700.00, and an allowance of \$300.00 for any necessary extra clerk hire.

To take care of this change in the budget an amount of \$1,300.00 to be transferred from the unbudgeted item in the departmental budget to the Register of Deeds department, increasing the budget of this department from \$7,800.00 to \$9,100.00. The motion carried.

A motion was made By Frost, seconded by Malow, that the rates to be charged for services in the Register of Deeds office be on the same basis as in the past two years, according to the following schedule: The rate to be increased if the instrument is larger than average, which increase is to be at the discretion of the Register of Deeds. Cash is to accompany all instruments when they are presented to the office for record. The motion carried.







It is estimated departmental revenues of \$20,000.00 will be collected during the year which would make a tax of \$179,211.00 necessary to cover the proposed budget. The committees also submit for your approval items to cover special work amounting to \$14,419.50.

We further recommend:

That the Sheriff be allowed six additional men for a road patrol and an additional allowance for car hire of \$2,000.00 to take care of two patrol cars fully equipped with radio.

That the Sheriff be allowed twenty cents for each meal furnished prisoners.

October 16, 1935

That the per diem allowance for Poor Commissioners be set at \$5.00 per day, and five cents per mile for actual necessary traveling.

That all traveling to State Institutions be set at five cents per mile.

That defense attorneys, appointed by the Court, be paid according to the following schedule:


