Mr. Ruifrok reviewed the plans for remodeling the Martha Berry Hospital and stated that, after many corrections were made by the authorities from Lansing, he felt these plans would now be approved for the use of the building for patients under Title 18 and 19. Due to the necessary corrections and changes in the original program, the estimated cost at present is \$440,000.00. Mr. Rosso stated that it is very imperative that this remodeling be done as soon as possible so that they may qualify for these programs.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Rowley, supported by Clark, that the Committee recommend to the Board that the Architect be authorized to proceed with final plans for remodeling the Martha Berry Hospital and adding a new kitchen, estimated cost of \$440,000.00. Plans are to be drawn after receipt of the final approval from State Health Authorities. Motion carried.

The question of two Branch Health Centers was discussed by the Committee, after having been brought to its attention by the Health Committee. These centers were included in the 701 Planning Program submitted to the Board of Supervisors several months ago.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Bade, supported by Cardamone, that the Committee recommend to the Board that the Health Committee and Health Department be authorized to investigate proper locations for the two health centers to be located in the Southern portion of Macomb County, as recommended by the Planning Commission under the 701 Program; each center to have approximately 5,300 square feet of space. The County will also purchase all the furniture for the new building and pay the architects fee, which in total will amount to approximately \$1,000,000.00, that will be paid from the Building and Sites Fund. This will reduce the total amount of bonds that will have to be issued.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Carl Weymouth, supported by Rowley, that the committee recommend to the Board that bonds be issued for an amount of \$5,800,000.00 over a 25 year period and that the annual lease be set at \$435,000.00 starting June 1, 1969. The contract entered into is for an amount of \$10,000.00. The Committee received a request from the Health Committee and the Health Board for the addition of one Account Clerk I to the Budget of the Health Department. It was explained that this position is to assist the department in the necessary book work required to record the Home Nursing Program under Medicare and Blue Cross. A charge is made for this service, sufficient funds will be collected to pay for the additional employee.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Buss, supported by Levine, that the Committee recommend to the Board that one Account Clerk I, salary minimum \$4,142.00 and Maximum \$4,977.00 be added to the budget of the Health Department. Motion carried.

At the request of the Safety Committee, this Committee met with Mr. Maltese and Mr. Ed Beck, representing the Macomb County Traffic Safety Association. These gentlemen reviewed the work of the Traffic Association for the past year and made an appeal to the Committee for an appropriation from the County. The County originally appropriated \$15,000.00 as an establishment grant and the County Road Department contributed \$10,000.00. Mr. Maltese explained that they were able to take care of the 1966 budget because part of the establishment grant was still available. However, sufficient funds to this date have not been collected from private firms to cover their full required budget for the ensuing year.

The Controller reported to the Committee that certain departments had deficits in their budget for the year 1966 as outlined in the Annual Report.

House Bill 2413, previously approved by the Board, authorizing certain changes in the publishing of bills for the County is in Committee and we have asked for favorable action.

Mr. McPeters reported that Mr. Roberts, Chairman of the Lake Hazards Committee, Mr. Damon and himself, met with a representative of the Governor to discuss the Holding Tank Bill governing the pollution of our streams. This legislation has been referred to the Water Resources Commission by the Governor. The Committee is interested in making several amendments to the present bill as it has been introduced, including changing the authority from the Water Resources to the Health Department.

The proposed Fiscal Reform bills before the State Legislature were discussed. Mr. Tallman stated that in his review of the bill, it would appear there is very little fiscal reform. Most of the legislation is an increase of existing taxes.

The Committee met to review several recommendations made by the Personnel Committee and also several other items to be discussed.

The following recommendations were made for the Martha Berry Medical Facility by the Personnel Committee:

Administrator, present salary maximum \$11,000.00, change to \$10,500.00 to \$12,500.00.

Assistant Administrator and Pharmacist, salary \$9,000.00, change to \$11,000.00.

Executive Housekeeper, \$5,350.00 to \$6,350.00. Delete Housekeeper Leader, \$4,488.00 to \$4,900.00.

Six new Nurses Aids, \$4,388.00 to \$4,800.00 = \$28,800.00. Total increase: \$33,750.00. Sufficient funds available, no new appropriation required.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Underwood, supported by Waterman, the Committee approve the recommendations of the Personnel Committee and recommend their adoption by the Board. Motion carried.

A request had previously been made and approved, recommending one Steno-Clerk II for the Legislative Coordinator Office. This particular item was not included in the budget for 1967. The Personnel Committee recommended that the employee be temporarily under the jurisdiction of the County Controller until it is determined whether or not use will be made of the Stenographer by other than the Legislative Coordinator.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Waterman, supported by Ryan, the Committee recommend to the Board that a Steno-Clerk II be added to the budget for the use of the Legislative Coordinator and other officials if found necessary. Motion carried.

The Juvenile Committee recommended the salary of the Case Work Supervisor and the Psychologist be increased \$350.00 each as of January 1, 1967. The reason is due to an apparent error at the time the original budget was prepared. Other officers in the department received a \$700.00 increase, and this change is to bring these two positions up to this total increase for the year. This was approved by the Personnel Committee.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Ryan, supported by Beck, the Committee recommend to the Board that the budget of the Juvenile Court be increased by one Steno Clerk I, salary \$4,142.00 to 4,977.00. Motion carried.

Sheriff's Department: A request has been made on several occasions by the Sheriff for additional assistance within the jail. Two officers were approved by the Sheriff's Committee in 1966, but no action was taken by this committee in the October session.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Buss, supported by Okros, the Committee recommend to the Board that two additional Deputies be added to the budget of the Sheriff's Department, salary \$6,850.00 to \$7,700.00. These Officers are to be used in the Jail. Motion carried.

Probate Court: Judge Parent has asked that the Committee review the salary for the Court Reporter. This was done, the Personnel Committee recommended a change in the maximum salary from \$7,711.00 to \$8,500.00.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Waterman, supported by Ryan, the Committee recommend to the Board that the salary of the Court Reporter in the Probate Court be increased from \$7,711.00 to \$8,500.00. Motion carried.

The questions of provisions in the Annual Leave and Sick Leave Ordinance for department heads annual leave were discussed with the Committee. There appeared to be some difference of opinion as to the meaning of the wording in the ordinance covering this particular item. It was suggested by the Controller that there be a clarification so the proper records could be continued.

The proposed State Fiscal Reform package was discussed by Mr. McPeters, with various tax for personal, corporate and financial institution rates.

Mr. McPeters stated that Wayne County also is proposing an additional 2% County Tax. Under the State proposals, counties get no share of State Income Tax, under either House or Senate Bills. Wayne County proposal would be split 1% to cities, 1/2 of 1% to both the schools and counties.

Mr. McPeters reported House Bill 2884, Apportionment of Boards of Supervisors, the bill delays apportionment from May 15, 1967 to May 15, 1971.

Mrs. Stark reported that the Publishing Bill is now going to the Towns and Counties Committee.

Mrs. Stark has talked to Senator Bowman regarding the hold up for Senate Bill No. 31, pending consideration of the recommended change by the Department of Public Health.

REAPPORTIONMENT COMMITTEE: Mr. Parris, Chairman, addressed the Committee regarding the present twenty-one member maximum. The next meeting will be in early April, 1967. Number of members to be between a minimum of five and a maximum of twenty-one. He also discussed part time and full time supervisors. No firm number was set at this time by the Apportionment Committee.

Mr. Garwood stated that the entire matter is under discussion and he and the Apportionment Committee would welcome comments and suggestions from any of the Supervisors.

Mrs. Dunnell stated this was her first meeting since being elected and she had no comment at this time.

At a meeting of the Building Committee held on Thursday, April 13, 1967, the following members were present:

The Committee met with an engineer of the Detroit Edison Company and representatives of the Architect, Ellis-Naeyaert Associates. The purpose was to discuss the suggestion that the present County Building receive its electrical service from the new building when completed. This would enable the service in the County Building to be charged on the basis of the bulk power rates. The additional cost for transformers and engineering work is estimated to be \$10,000.00. The Detroit Edison stated there would be an approximate savings to the County for power in the present building of \$3,500.00 annually, based upon the present usage.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Ray Brandenburg, supported by Wulf, that the Committee recommend that the Architects be authorized to include in their plans, the necessary specifications for changing the source of power from the County Building to the so-called primary service in order to secure the bulk power rate. Motion carried.

The Committee reviewed with the Architects for the new building several suggested changes that have been made previously by the Committee. The total estimated cost is \$169,000.00. These include changing the parking lot, changing the Snack Bar in the basement and other essential items.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Rowley, supported by Clark, the Committee approve the changes as listed and recommend they be included in the general specifications. Motion carried.

The Committee discussed with Dr. Stryker the suggested alterations in the Martha Berry Hospital to accommodate additional coolers for the Morgue. At the present time there are two and there is a great need for some additional space. The Architects now preparing the plans for remodeling the building have submitted a plan which would enable the County to have a total of six coolers. The additional cost would be approximately \$25,000.00.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Wulf, supported by Mrs. Vlaich, the Committee approve the request of Dr. Stryker and recommend the plans for the remodeling of the Martha Berry Hospital include the change in the Morgue facilities. Motion carried.

It was reported to the Committee that there is a building available on Harper Avenue near Ten Mile Road in St. Clair Shores for purchase. The Committee recently discussed the recommendation of the Health Committee that a site be found for the construction of a branch Health Center to take care of the area of East Detroit, Roseville, St. Clair Shores and possibly the southern part of Clinton and Harrison Townships. The Community Mental Health Board is also interested in securing additional space.

The Chairman of the Board; the Chairmen of the Building Committee, Health Committee and Community Health Board; the Controller and Dr. Stryker visited the building in question and reported to the Committee that it would be a very good location for the activities and could easily be converted into office space for the two departments. The Community Mental Health Board would lease space from the County for their area.

The building contains a total of 25,000 square feet, 15,000 located in one large former supermarket and the balance divided into five individual stores that are now under lease. In addition, there is parking space for approximately 135 cars in the front of the building and an additional 50 cars at the rear. There is also vacant property containing an additional 15,000 square feet. Total cost, \$259,500.00. The building is approximately 11 years old.

An opinion was received from Civil Counsel stating that it would be legal for the County to purchase the property and also to sub-lease it as found necessary.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Mrs. Vlaich, supported by Cardamone, the Committee recommend to the Board that the County purchase the property located on Harper Avenue east of Ten Mile Road in St. Clair Shores, for the sum of \$259,500.00. Motion carried.

The Controller reported to the Committee that as yet no available space for rental has been found to house the Agriculture Office and the office of Veterans Affairs. These moves have been considered in order to furnish additional space in the Engineering Building and in the Juvenile Section of the Probate Building.

BUDGET COMMITTEE MEETING - APRIL 20, 1967

Attached hereto is the schedule of the proposed budget, a total of \$11,761,636.00. This will require in addition to the revenues as listed, an estimated cash balance of \$708,388.00 and a receipt from current taxes of \$9,688,248.00. The required tax rate based on the estimated State Equalized Valuation of \$1,944,494,802.00 will be 5.19 or \$5.19 per thousand. This is based upon 90% current collection.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Back, supported by Buss, that the Committee recommend to the Board a tentative budget for 1968 of \$11,761,636.00, and that it be presented to the Tax Allocation Board with the request for a levy of \$5.19 per thousand. Motion carried.

This is the same rate allocated to the County for the current year.

A letter was read to the Committee that was received from Mr. Prescott, Director of the Cooperative Extension Service. In presenting his budget for 1967, an error was made in his request for supplementary salary for an agent furnished by the State. His request was \$4,500.00 and the amount required is \$7,500.00.

1951 - 9; 1952 - none; 1953 - 6; 1954 - 7; For the years 1955, 1956, 1957 & 1958 - no cases.

The Chief Dog Warden reported to the Committee that during the month of April 1314 dogs were taken into the pound. Of this number 85 were returned to owners, 129 sold and the balance were disposed of.

He reported to the Committee that due to the quarantine that is now in effect, that it has been necessary in the past two weeks to have his Wardens work an extra day in order to properly patrol the area covered by quarantines. He suggested that he be allowed to continue using his wardens on an overtime basis as required.

Mr. Beutel was called upon and stated that he wished to represent himself as he had no engineer. He stated that he had purchased the 15 acres of ground involved with the intention of building a home for himself and his wife. There would be two people living in the home.

He had contacted his contractor and also the septic tank contractor and both informed him they felt there would be no difficulty in laying a proper tile field to handle the septic tank for his home. He stated he felt the percolation test was taken at the wrong time of the year and that it was his intention to raise the grade of the property sufficient to take care of the necessary flow from the septic tank. He further stated that the house located next to his property has used a septic tank for a period of five years with no apparent difficulty. It was his intention to build only one home on the 15 acre plot of land.

Several questions were asked of Mr. Beutel and Mr. Damon by members of the Committee and Board.

The Chairman asked if anyone had any further comment and hearing none, he declared the review closed. Time 10:00 A.M.

The County Road Committee met with the Mayors of the Cities of Macomb County and the Township Supervisors, at the request of Mayor McDonald of Roseville, to discuss the I-696 freeway.

Chairman Bates called upon Mayor McDonald to explain the program as recently discussed by his community.

Mayor McDonald explained that Roseville had realized that the I-696 freeway is important and had asked for the meeting to discuss the question of financing. He stated that he felt that inasmuch as it would be a benefit not only to their community, but to all communities in the County, and especially the south end of the County, that the County, through the Road Commission, should make a contribution to the City share of the cost of this freeway.

It was pointed out to the members present that through the construction of the freeway, all the communities would be relieved of part of their obligation as far as other mile roads in the area. It has been estimated by the County Road Commission that if the freeway was constructed, the total cost for the freeway and other mile road widenings, would be approximately \$71,800,000.00. Of this amount, the State Highway and the Federal Government would contribute approximately \$57,600,000.00. If the freeway is not constructed, it will be necessary to have a further widening program for all the mile roads in the area at a total cost of approximately \$52,500,000.00. All of this will necessarily have to be paid by the County Road Commission and the local communities. There will be no State or Federal Government contribution.

In view of this fact, it is quite evident that the construction of the freeway would lessen the cost to all the communities and the County.

COMMITTEE ACTION: A motion was made by Zoccola, supported by Okros, the Committee recommend to the County Road Commission that they change their policy and, in the future, participate in the cost of the Cities' share of the construction of freeways the same as they do at the present time in the construction of other County highways. This participation to be only on the routes approved by the County Road Commission. On roll call vote, the motion carried.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Inwood, supported by Schoof, the Committee recommend that the County contribution to TALUS be based upon the 1970 census instead of the requested 1980 census. Motion carried.

A question had been raised about the right of the Road Commission to determine the extent of their contributions to highway improvement and construction costs, and Mr. Blomberg stated that the Road Commission has the right to enter into an agreement with the Municipality involved and to determine the extent of their contribution. After a great deal of discussion, motion was made by Ryan, supported by Blahnik, that the Committee report be received, filed and recommendations adopted. Ayes all except one nay (Merrelli). Motion carried and the committee report follows:

At a meeting of the D.P.W. and Road Committee held on Wednesday, July 12, 1967, the following members were present:

In the absence of the Chairman Ted Bates, Vice-Chairman Inwood conducted the meeting.

Others present: Commissioners Lawrence Oehmke, Keith Bovenschen and Ernest McCollom; Edward Platt, Assistant Highway Engineer and Richard Eschenburg, Highway Secretary.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 A.M. in the offices of the Macomb County Engineering Building. Chairman Inwood appointed Richard Eschenburg as Acting Secretary in the absence of the Controller.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss a proposal that the formula for participation of the County in the construction of road bridges be revised. The County Board of Supervisors in 1961, first established the County Bridge Account in the General Fund. At that time, the formula was as follows:

Macomb County Road Commission 50% of cost; Township involved 25% of cost and County of Macomb 25% of cost.

The Commissioners presented to the Committee a recommendation that this formula be changed as follows:

Macomb County Road Commission 50% of cost. Township or Village 25% but not to exceed \$3,000.00. County of Macomb the balance of the cost.

All expenditures from the County of Macomb account shall be approved by the D.P.W. and Road Committee and shall not exceed the appropriation allocated by the Board for this purpose. After considerable discussion and explanation by the Road Commission,

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: A motion was made by Whedon, supported by Tomlinson, the Committee recommend to the County Board of Supervisors that the formula for payment of funds from the County Bridge Account be changed to read as follows:

Macomb County Road Commission 50% of cost.

Township on local road system 25%, but not to exceed \$3,000.00 County of Macomb the balance.

On primary systems within the city or village:

Macomb County Road Commission 50% of cost. Village 25%, but not to exceed \$3,000.00. County of Macomb the balance.

All appropriations from the County Account shall be approved by the D.P.W. and Road Committee. Motion carried.

Drain Commissioner Thomas Welsh, appeared before the Committee and discussed with the members of the Committee the general policy recommendations pertaining to the functions of his department acting under Act 342.

It was agreed by Mr. Welsh that his department is interested primarily in assisting the local communities and not necessarily doing the work for them. His department will assist in:

- 1. Planning
- 2. Coordination
- 3. Financing of any project they are interested in.

He further stated that it would be possible through the use of Act 342 to pledge the full faith and credit of Macomb County for financing. The entire costs however, are to be paid by the local community. He stated that further recommendations would be made to the Committee at a later date.

A motion was made by Tomlinson, supported by Zoccola, that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

This particular program at the present time is confined to cities, villages and townships.

At a previous meeting, information secured from the Planning Commission and the Health Department, indicated that over half of the units in Selfridge Homes could not meet the Clinton Township Housing Code and the balance would need a considerable amount of rehabilitation before they could be used. It was suggested that the only relief would be an amendment to the State law which would permit Counties to come under the slum clearance Act of 1963.

COMMITTEE ACTION: Motion was made by VerKuilen, supported by Mrs. Lane, that Civil Counsel be instructed to prepare a recommendation to be submitted to the Legislative Committee, legislation that would authorize the County to establish a Public Housing Project. Motion carried.

The Committee reviewed the report of the Radio Committee in which they recommended certain changes in the policy of the Radio Department governing stand-by services for week-end and evenings. After considerable discussion, the Committee agreed upon the following regulations:

- 1. All employees of the Radio Department, except the Engineer and the Assistant Engineer, receive pay at the regular rate for being on call from 8:30 A.M. Saturday to 8:30 A.M. Sunday, 2.4 hours; 8:30 A.M. Sunday to 8:30 A.M. Monday, 2.4 hours; and for any Holiday falling on other than Saturday or Sunday, regular pay for 2.4 hours. If an employee is called on a service call during the standby period, he is to receive time and one half (1&2) of the regular pay rate for length of service call required; the amount so received to be deducted from the stand-by allowance of 2.4 hours.
- 2. No stand-by payment to be made for week nights. Any call however, will be paid at one and one-half time the regular rate and there will be a minimum of two (2) hours allowed for each call.
- 3. For hours worked in excess of their regular working week, employee is to receive pay at the rate of one and one-half time the regular hourly rate.
- 4. All after hours service shall be charged to the Municipal agency demanding the service at the rates established by the Board of Supervisors for pay to the employees.

The above regulations to be effective with the week-end commencing Saturday, August 19, 1967. From that date on, there will be no further compensatory time off allowed.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS: A motion was made by Okros, supported by Beck, the Committee approve the above regulations and recommend them to the Board of Supervisors. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Bates, supported by Okros, the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

That full paid certified hospitalization insurance be furnished all employees and their families included in the budget. There is no change for 1968.

Life Insurance:

Each employee to be covered by \$3,000.00 life insurance paid in full by the County. Appropriation is increased from \$20,000.00 to \$22,000.00.

Retirement:

Appropriation for Retirement in General Fund is \$375,000.00. This is an increase from \$235,000.00 due in part to change of benefits authorized effective January 1, 1967.

Social Security:

Rate for 1968 is 4.4%, on an increased base.

TRAVEL AND CAR ALLOWANCE:

The officials and employees be allowed the following for mileage on a monthly basis:

12¢ per mile for the first 500 miles 10¢ per mile for the next 500 miles 8¢ per mile for all mileage over 1,000 miles

Requests for mileage payments are to be filed on forms furnished by the Controller. Forms must be filed at least sixty (60) days after expense has been incurred.

That any county employee requiring expenses for an overnight stay for a meeting, convention or any county business must submit an itemized expense account to be approved by the Finance Committee. No expense will be allowed for trips outside the state unless they have first been authorized by the Finance Committee. A maximum of \$20.00 per day for expenses, plus transportation and convention registrations, will be allowed; the committee is authorized to approve an additional allowance if information is furnished that will justify the additional amount.

COUNTY VEHICLES:

That all motor vehicles owned by the county and operated by the departments within this budget have adequate markings on both side doors identifying it as a county vehicle. Monthly mileage reports giving daily speedometer readings and brief descriptions of trips made are to be filed with the Controller. Gasoline for vehicles to be secured from the county pump. Exceptions to this rule are to be authorized by this committee.

The salary increase includes \$94,099.00 for fifteen (15) positions added during 1967, sixty five (65) new employees were added to the Budget amounting to \$403,635.00, the balance of \$528,004.00 represents adjustments and salary increases for employees. Minimum increase is \$350.00.

If any additional expenditure is needed for clerk hire in any department, it shall be first approved by the Board of Supervisors.

Salaries January 1, 1968:

Each employee remaining in same classification will receive an adjustment equal to the amount added to the maximum of the position unless otherwise specified by the Budget Committee. An employee whose classification has been changed will receive one (1) normal increment plus \$350.00. These increases will not change the increment schedule for the employees who are entitled to increments due on anniversary dates.

Salaries are to be paid bi-weekly on the basis of twenty six (26) pay periods of ten (10) days each, based on annual salary.

Holiday Pay:

That employees who qualify now working in departments that are on a twenty four (24) hour, seven (7) day week basis, namely the Sheriff Department, Martha Berry Hospital, Youth Home and certain Maintenance Mechanics be compensated for eight (8) holidays. Payment to be made according to contracts. If an employee works part of the year, compensation is to be adjusted accordingly. Payment to be based on the salary scale in effect on date of payment. The holidays included in the above are New Years, Washingtons Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

EMPLOYEES - SALARIES - CLASSIFICATION CHANGES:

New Employees:

A new employee is to be started at the minimum salary designated for the position to be used; provided, however, upon consultation between the department head and the County Controller, the employee, if he or she has had previous experience in work similar to the type of work to be performed for the county, may be given credit for one-half of such experience and the minimum salary may be increased on the basis of increments allowed if said employee had been employed by the county. In no case, however, shall the starting salary be in excess of one-half of the total increments allowed in the salary range. If the department head is desirous of allowing a greater starting salary than set forth above, it must be approved by the Chairman of the Budget Committee, County Controller and the particular department head.

Salary Increments:

After employment, each employee will be entitled to one normal increment after twenty six (26) weeks of continuous employment. All increments to be approved by the department head before becoming effective.

Classification Transfer:

Any transfer or change of classification of an employee must first be approved by the Chairman of the Budget Committee, the County Controller and the head of the particular department. Before approval is granted, a written statement is to be filed by the department head with the Controller explaining the reason for the transfer or change and an explanation of the work to be performed by the employee. In addition to the above, a written test may be required if it is deemed necessary.

New Classifications or Additional Employees:

Any department head wishing to have a new employee added or new classification during the year should submit the request in writing to the County Controller. Request is to contain a description of work to be performed. After a review with the department head, the Controller is instructed to submit information prepared to the Personnel Committee for approval before submitting to the Budget Committee and the Board of Supervisors.

Personnel:

That the Controller continue the present policy of conducting tests for prospective employees and cooperate with the Personnel Committee in any further studies of personnel problems.

FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS:

Credit Union:

Authorize the deduction of savings for the Employees Credit Union once each month. First deduction to be made on the first pay check after July 1, 1967. Authorization to be furnished by each employee on form approved. Forms to be filed with the Controller at least ten (10) days prior to deduction date.

Sheriff Meals:

Sheriff to be allowed to continue furnishing meals to prisoners.

Rectigraph:

All departments are requested to make use of the rectigraph machine for copying records where at all possible. All public records in the various departments to be kept in the proper filing sequence.

Excess Expense:

If any expenses in any department equals the amount set in the budget prior to December 31, 1968, additional allowance must be made by the Board of Supervisors before any additional expenditures can be incurred.
