James; there was an agreement. He said he would like a copy of the agreement. He said there should be a contract with the Agents of Record and it should state what the Agent of Record would do for the money paid him.

He spoke about a service agreement with Sedgwick James to administer the Workman's Compensation for one year for \$37,000, which was paid in advance January 1, 1994; and that they would automatically renew for another year. He said they should not pay in advance.

He said this motion should go back to the Ad Hoc Committee because the motion on the floor says Sedgwick James and Gallager will be Agents of Record, but doesn't say in what area the agents will work. It doesn't say how much Sedgwick Jamesand Gallager would be compensated. He said the nine people interviewed should be interviewed again and determined which bid was lowest for the services rendered.

There was lengthy discussion.

Replying to questions, Mr. Brumbaugh said the County pays for the insurance; the Agent of Record is paid through the insurance company, receiving a commission.

At Committee meeting Mr. Hack was requested to call the State Insurance Commission to inquire about a contract for Agents of Record. Mr. Hack explained you do not contract with the Agent of Record, they are the agents for the Insurance Companies. The contracts are with the insurance companies. The insurance policy indicates what is covered in the contract. Agents are licensed from the State of Michigan to sell insurance.

Commissioner Switalski reviewed some of the questions that were discussed in committee. Having contacted other cities and counties it was concluded no other Agent of Record has a contract.

Commissioner Switalski said with reference to the December agreement to have Sedgwick James service the Workers Compensation program it was established there was a written agreement.

Mr. Hack said other payment arrangements could be made, but at additional cost. It was to the County's advantage to pay in advance. The contract was reviewed by Corporation Counsel, Finance Director and the Risk Manager.

Commissioner Switalski said the Committee acted in good faith and they picked the two people they thought best for the County. They inquired and found the agreement being asked for did not exist. He said there was no reason to delay this and he would vote against the referral motion.

Commissioners Brown, DeSaele and Sessa spoke in favor of the referral motion.

Commissioners Kolakowski and Slinde spoke against the referral motion.

Commissioner Chrzanowski called for the question.

Commissioner Fraschetti said there was no contract for Agents of Record and Mr. Hack was going to prepare a letter of appointment. He said they do review all contracts; vehicle liability, public officals liability, events liability, etc. throughout the year. He was opposed to the referral motion.

Chairman Steenbergh said there would be two Agents of Record and they would shop the market in each area where the County is insured, secure the best prices, reviewing everything, including the stability of each company. Instead of one agent they will have two Agents of Record. Then, the contracts would come back before the Board.

Commissioner Burdi said the agent handling this kind of money should have a contract. He did not think there was anything improper. He brought up the contract for services of workman's compensation because unless you get contracts for review first, you get contracts that do not

say what was intended. He said it was not defined what the agents were to do and each agent has indicated a different method of payment. He said it should be reconsidered.

REPORT BY JUDGE GEORGE STEEH III on Federal Crime Initiative and What it means to the Cou

Judge Steeh said the effect of the Federal Crime Initiative would be an increase in funding for local police departments and drug treatment for inmates. He said judges face difficult decisions whether or not to send someone to a state facility where they will get no treatment or to the county facility where they have great drug treatment. The County facility becomes overburdened because they want rehabilitation. With money from Washington they would be able to send many offenders where they can get help. They should encourage the State to develop laws to sentence juvenile offenders to longer terms in a place separate from adult offenders. They need to have options. They should urge the Federal Government to make money available for Court House security, which is becoming a national problem.

He said there was money available under guidelines of new laws, making it likely for the County to get back federal funds. He said his trip to Washington was well justified in the knowledge he gained, and the funding he believes they will be able to get.

Answering questions, Judge Steeh said Judge Janet Reno was bright and had a very firm knowledge and understanding for the need of cooperation with local officials in order to achieve an impact on the crime problem.

#### SHERIFF HACKEL - OVERTIME REQUEST FOR RENOVATIONS AT THE JAIL

The Sheriff said Tuesday they received a call from Jackson Prison. There were 63 prisoners from Jackson that were going to be testifying on a case that occurred within that facility in which a female corrections officer was killed. They would like to accomposate them if they could find a way to expedite renovations now in progress at the jail. It should not exceed 2000 hours or 10 days overtime for various skilled trades people. They would be reimbursed \$35 a day for each prisoner and the trial would probably last 5 to 7 weeks. Enough revenue would be generated to pay for the work.

### PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Ms. Darlene Jewett, Clinton Township

Ms. Jewett read from the Bible and recalled incidents in her family resulting in the Vietnam war era.

Donna Gides, New Baltimore

Mrs. Gides presented petitions to Chairman Steenbergh signed by 600 members of the Macomb County Retirement System objecting to certain members using \$4,984 of the funds of the System to attend seminars in Hawaii, and considered it an abuse of discretion.

Bonnie Haines, Vice-president Local 411, Harrison Township resident

Mrs. Haines presented a resolution to the Board and the Retirement Commission from AFSCME Local 411 that members of the Retirement Commission attend only conferences held with the 48 continental states. Only one member attend, on a rotation basis; Reimbursements for travel have limitations; and any frequent flyer credits should be accrued to the Retirement System; no gratuities should be received by any member of the Retirement Board, broker, bank or business and a report on the Conference be made available to any member of the retirement system on request.

John Saile, President of Local 893, Armada resident

Mr. Saile said the local officers, Executive Board and members did not take action against sending delegates to the upcoming retirement conference. The resolution that they have identifying Local 893 as a sponsor has not been approved by Local 893 Executive Board and members and is not properly before them. The goal of the Local 893 is that the Retirement system be managed properly and remain solvent.

Hermanie Gormey, Warren

Mrs. Gormey said President Nixon had made a Republican out of her, because he was against bureaucracy and programs that were not working, and he was the first president to give a raise to the people on Social Security. She spoke about the roll of the U.N.; and in support of policemen. She said there was a decline of law and order and lack of respect for the law.

Julie Majcher, Clinton Township

Ms. Majcher was concerned that the Health-o-rama Centers that give various tests were going to be closed, in particular the SHAPE program at Harper and 10 Mile. She told of her health problems that were detected in time through these tests that were provided by the County.

Chairman Steenbergh assured her tests would still be available.

Commissioner Brandenburg asked for a separation of motion #2.

Vote was taken on all other recommendations and the motion carried.

### 2. SEPARATED MOTION

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SWITALSKI, SUPPORTED BY HILL, TO RECOMMEND THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZE THE MACOMB COUNTY CLERK/REGISTER OF DEEDS TO ENTER INTO A THREE-YEAR CONTRACT WITH BUSINESS RECORDS CORPORATION (BRC) TO ACQUIRE SERVICES AS PRESENTED AT THE PER INSTRUMENT CHARGE OF \$1.50 PER DOCUMENT FOR THE AUTOMATION OF THE REGISTER OF DEEDS OFFICE. THE MOTION CARRIED.

A motion was made by Commissioner Brandenburg, supported by Commissioner Strizic, to refer this back to Legislative and Administrative Services Committee.

Mrs. Brandenburg said she had researched this proposal and talked with several people who said electronic records were not considered legal copies; they should wait another six months for an Attorney General's opinion. She was against the bidding process used. She said the figures were very good if they worked, but if not, it was going to cost the County a lot of money. She agreed the Department needed updating, which she said could be done with a couple of copiers and microfilm cameras.

It was stated that bids were received; and staff from MIS, after assessing the needs of the Register of Deeds office, visited each of the vendors.

Carmella Sabaugh, County Clerk and Register of Deeds, said imaging records was a legal document; Oakland County was using imaging and microfilm. She said they had worked with MIS and Planning, developed RFP and put it out to bid. Every vendor came to the office. It had taken nine or ten months. The staff in the Register of Deeds Office had done a tremendous job, doing 800 documents a day; and continuing with the present staff, they would be able to do more and generate more money. She said there were a lot of companies. The ones that wanted to meet the proposals were two companies that had been in the Register of Deeds business. Automated at \$1.50 a document, the cost would be covered. This was not going to cost the County money. In the Clerks Election Department they were able to bid out election supplies at a large savings.

Mr. Diegel said they anticipated this system would generate a half million dollars. He said clearly microfilming is legal and they would continue to have a microfilm copy.

After some discussion, Commissioner Hill CALLED FOR THE QUESTION.

The CALL FOR THE QUESTION FAILED, and discussion continued.

Commissioners Burdi, Chrzanowski and Slinde commended the Clerk and technical staff on saving the County money by acquiring services through BRC and being very innovative in bringing this to the Board.

Commissioner Brandenburg commended the Clerk for doing this, but said she had a problem with sending documents out for 24 hours; and if changes could be made.

It was explained that the original document would never leave the office. The document would be imaged and microfilm copy would be sent back in 24 hours. After that the original document would be mailed back to the lender. You could not change image. This was a new technique being used all over the country.

Concerning legality, John Lockwood, representing BRC, said it would not matter, they were using microfilm as a back-up. He said the whole process is to protect anything from happening. The process is set up to follow statutes to guarantee certifying copies.

Commissioner Brandenburg said there could be a possibility of changing something.

Commissioner White CALLED FOR THE QUESTION.

THE CALL FOR THE QUESTION FAILED.

Commissioner Brandenburg said it should be re-evaluated.

# STATE OF THE JUDICIARY - Chief Judge Peter Maceroni

Judge Maceroni introduced Dee Van Horn, State Court Administrator, and Barry Joseph who were visiting the Circuit Court of Macomb County today.

Judge Maceroni gave a report to the Board, noting the continuing increase in caseload handled by each Judge and even with the help of Judge Jeannette, it was becoming clear, Macomb County was in need of more judges. He also urged the Board members to visit the court in New Baltimore; it's overcrowded condition was an embarrassment to the County.

These were revenue sharing checks that were due the three entities and were dated August 1.

She said the material was being picked up and dumped out further in the lake. She had concern they would be faced with the same problem later. When the Health Department tested in June they said the beaches were closed to swimming. She said tests done in July in some areas indicated a count of 25,000, much higher than the count in June of 200. No one was telling the people in Harrison Township what to do about the stench in their backyards. It was not just a problem at Metro Beach.

She asked that the Board direct the necessary money to the Health Department to continue to do testing inside the beach area but also other areas.

She estimated losses to businesses in the area at 1.5 million dollars, and urged the Board to put pressure on the state to help people in Harrison Township and also the St. Clair shores.

Susan Hire, Washington, Mi

Ms. Hire was concerned about misuse of taxpayers dollars, for attorneys to defend children in court as well as a mother, who abused them. The mother moved to Missouri and transportation and lodging was provided for her several times. She said it should be investigated.

Vote was taken on the SEPARATED MOTION and the MOTION CARRIED with Commissioner Brandenburg voting No.

### 9. SEPARATED MOTION

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SWITALSKI, SUPPORTED BY KABACINSKI TO RECOMMEND THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ALLOW THE MACOMB COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO CONTRACT WITH CRT MANAGEMENT COMPANY FOR MEDICARE BILLING AND ASSOCIATED REPORT SERVICES, PENDING THE CONTRACT COMING BACK TO THE BOARD FOR APPROVAL. THE MOTION CARRIED, with Brandenburg voting NO.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sowerby to AMEND THE MOTION and eliminate the wording "PENDING THE CONTRACT COMING BACK TO THE BOARD FOR APPROVAL". The motion was supported by Commissioner DiMaria.

# NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by Commissioner Sessa, supported by Commissioner Kabacinski, to suspend the rules in order to consider declaring a continuance of a state of emergency in Macomb County.

He said there was evidence that no help would be coming from state or federal funds, and there was a need to compensate the local communities for the economical crises that exists. Some businesses were 95% off; property values had gone down; the beaches were a disaster area, with less than half of the people showing up; boat launches were down 65%, and there were few boats on the lake. He said the only way around it, was to reinstate the state of emergency to seek federal assistance.

Commissioner Kolakowski said they declared a State of Emergency 10 days ago, that was in effect 7 days, and in the eyes of the law, has expired. The Chief Elected Official can no longer call a state of emergency, but it must be called by all of them.

Vote was taken to SUSPEND THE RULES, and the MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

#### MOTION

A motion was made jointly by Commissioners Sessa, Kabacinski, Faschetti and Kuss that Macomb County Board of Commissioners as a body declare an economic and environmental state of emergency exists in Macomb County along the shoreline. (amendment follows)

Mr. Seehassee, Director of Emergency Services, spoke about what was being done to clean the shoreline and investigations were continuing in connection with the water-flow.

Mr. Lafferty, Director of the Health Department, advised that testings of the water were also continuing.

Mayor Ted Wahby, St. Clair Shores, expressed concern that while the water in the southern part of St. Clair Shores was not contaminated, they were losing much business on the lake because people were concerned. He said much money had been spent by these businessmen in an effort to educate the people that the Nautical Mile in St. Clair Shores did not have this problem. Declaring a continuing state of emergency would hinder their efforts.

Mr. Greg Brock said that the State Police in advising the Governor did not consider this a state of emergency. The Governor did review the situation and did order an emergency response....clean up of the beaches at Metro Park and in St. Clair Shores. He said the DNR and Health Department were investigating the waste water and flow in the area searching for any illegal hook-up. He said the declaration would not speed this up. On the whole, St. Clair Lake was clean. The Nautical Mile in St. Clair Shores was suffering an impact from the perception that the whole lake has the problem. From 12 samples recently taken from the lake the bacteria level was under 200. He said to continue the declaration would foster the perception the whole lake is in trouble and it was not.

Commissioner Sowerby said they have to compare the economical side and the community side of this issue. On the other side, residents who live along the shoreline can't stand the stench. With the declaration, they may get some help.

Commissioner Kolakowski said unless they declare the emergency, the FEMA funds would not be available.

Commissioner Burdi said they must also take precautions for the future, such as disconnecting down spouts in communities, relieving millions of gallons of water.

Commissioner Kabacinski had concern if the state pulled out before the problem was solved, it may happen again if dumps are being made they don't know about and rainfall is heavy. People along the lake have never seen this before.

Mr. McIntosh, Chemical Engineer and attorney, said it was the first time he had seen this since 1950. He said 128 million dollars had been spent to improve the sewer systems.

Commissioner Brandenburg said this was a horrendous health problem that will affect the drinking water; and harvesting the seaweed would not decrease the bacterial count. She said a number of communities, not in Macomb County, were dumping, altering the balance. She suggested inviting Senator Bonior and knowledgeable people that are representing the County. They would need cooperation from Oakland County also and would need a county-wide ordinance. Public health was what should be stressed.

Discussion continued and Commissioner Sessa asked for a ROLL CALL VOTE on the motion.

Commissioner Switalski made AN AMENDMENT TO THE MOTION: adding, "excluding the southern part of St. Clair Shores known as the Nautical Mile.

Commissioner Sessa said he would accept this amendment to his motion.

A motion was made jointly by Commissioners Sessa, Kabacinski, Fraschetti and Kuss that Macomb County Board of Commissioners as a body declare an economic and environmental State of Emergency exists in Macomb County along the shoreline, excluding the southern part of St. Clair Shores known as the Nautical Mile.

Proposed drafted Resolution and put Sterling Heights Commissioners on as co-sponsors, this was not meant to offend anyone. Lansing was sending a Resolution to the Pope and he felt it would be a good idea to present one on behalf of the County.

Steven DeLuca, 13839 Masonic, Warren, MI

Requested re-appointment to the Veterans Commission.

Commissioner Hill introduced the students of Mt. Clemens High School Government class which attended the Board of Commissioners meeting.

# COMMISSIONER THOMAS S. WELSH, ROAD COMMISSION OF MACOMB COUNTY AND THE HURON-CLINTON METROPOLITAN AUTHORITY

Commissioner Steenbergh's comments included that this item will focus on how the County got to where we are in the Clinton River watershed and Lake St. Clair. It is helpful that the Board consider its role in this matter. Tom Welsh served as the Macomb County Public Works Commissioner from 1961 to 1992 and currently serves as a member of the Road Commission of Macomb County and the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority. Ben Giampetroni, the Executive Director of Planning and Economic Development, provided an overview of the development in the Clinton River watershed and in Macomb County.

Ben Giampetroni discussed an overview of urban development in Macomb and Oakland Counties and the impact on development on the Clinton River Watershed and Lake St. Clair.

Mr. Welsh explained that the spillway is an overflow to prevent downstream flooding and today it

is not doing the job that it should do. Treatment plants' sole purpose to have these basins was to protect Lake St. Clair because 60% of our drinking water comes from the Lake. We need to have a goal of cleaning Lake St. Clair and River. There is a retention basin which brings sewage bits into Detroit aimed at protecting the River and the Lake. 760 square miles drain from the basin into the Lake from Detroit. Drainage legislation is minority legislation. Macomb County can authorize the Health Department to check pollutants entering the water. An amount of wild fowl contribute to pollution, even though it is a contributing factor, it is not the most major.

Tom Welsh discussed Wolcott Mill and how the County had planted four different types of Clover to study nutrient value and what it does to restoring conditions of the soil. Hopefully it will develop a more economical and productive way that farmers could use Clover instead of fertilizer.

The problem with mismanagement of systems is that they are not being adequately operated and we are not getting the maximum use of what we have. Mr. Welsh discussed the Henry Graham Drain issue and the weeping tiles in the homes south of 14 Mile Road. Water gets into the system and the only way out is an overflow into the River or Lake. This could create a major catastrophe!

The sanitary sewers and storm sewers of St. Clair Shores, Roseville and Eastpointe were discussed in length. Someday combined areas would be required to separate and current retention basins would serve the purpose of treating storm waters washed off of streets and parking lots. Retention basins can be converted.

The discussion of aquatic growth was covered and commented that there was not any qualified engineers in the area.

Commissioner Brown clarified that there are two fronts we need to operate from: 1) the St. Clair aquatic problem is the landlord's problem; and, 2) housekeeping to the Clinton River water basin. St. Clair aquatic problem should have conditions to the basin, Clinton River basin is now a liability to the system. It was recommended that the "12 Town" community maximize the use of what they have with local facilities. The Public Works Commission can not promote or further a project without a petition.

Commissioner Sowerby inquired about the DNR and Mr. Welsh indicated that the DNR should regulate aquatic growth, it is the designated EPA agency for Michigan. Macomb County Board of Commissioners should deal with legislation to correct this problem. The Health Department is in charge of water quality. The Department of Public Works advises the Health Department and they will enforce it.

Commissioner Hill had questions about the maintenance of the weir. It is the responsibility of Inter-County Drainage Board (the Secretary is the Macomb County Public Works Commissioner). The spillway municipality does not have responsibility to the Clinton River spillway Board, it is the Drainage Board.

Commissioner Brandenburg inquired about the Clinton River Drainage Board assessing everyone in the Clinton River Basin who is benefiting from the basin and wants to encourage separation of storm and sewage lines. Mr. Ronny Harms is in charge of the DNR.

In conclusion, he felt that the County Board of Commissioners should express its concern and keep the pressure on and discuss this with legislators, covey the proper resolutions, and to talk to people in power, we should let the community know that Macomb County is here and is available to them to be helpful.

Rule XII is Powers and Duties of Committees and Task Forces, would be defining what it does based on what the action was out of the rules committee: i. environmental contamination or pollution; ii. environmental protection.

Anytime citizens are employed at a skill level second to none to anyplace in the world can only make the quality of life in Macomb County better and the product delivered a better product. This will improve the quality of projects and to pay prevailing wages improves the lifestyles of families. He is eager to support.

### HEALTH SERVICES - November 15, 1994

The Clerk read the recommendations of the Health Services Committee and a MOTION was made by Chairman Sowerby, supported by Vice-Chairperson Rocca, to adopt the committee recommendations.

Commissioner Brandenburg asked for a separation of Motion #2.

Vote was taken on the following recommendation:

APPROVE THE PARTICIPATION OF THE MACOMB COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT IN THE REGIONAL HEALTHY MICHIGAN FUND CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE PREVENTION PROGRAM AND TO ACCEPT \$45,003 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH UNDER THIS PROGRAM TO PROVIDE CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE PREVENTION SERVICES IN MACOMB COUNTY.

### 2. SEPARATED MOTION

APPROVE THE PARTICIPATION BY THE MACOMB COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT IN A REGIONAL COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSESSMENT PROCESS THROUGH THE SOUTHEASTERN MICHIGAN HEALTH ASSOCIATION TO BE FUNDED BY THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH. THE MOTION CARRIED WITH SESSA VOTING "NO".

Several Commissioners expressed their concern of spending the \$86,000 from the state for this project and not reallocating the funds to other helpful needs.

Vote was taken on the SEPARATED MOTION and the MOTION CARRIED, with Commissioners' Brandenburg,

Gillett, Rocca, Strizic, Sessa, DeSaele, and Brown voting NO.

#### PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT - November 17, 1994

The Clerk read the recommendations of the Planning and Economic Development Committee and a MOTION was made by Chairman Hill, supported by Vice-Chair Swiatkowski, to adopt the committee recommendations.

Commissioner Brandenburg asked for a separation of Motion #1.

Vote was taken on the following recommendation:

2. APPROVE PUBLICATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF A 1995 MACOMB COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ANNUAL REPORT; FURTHER, THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE MACOMB COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE APPOINT AN ANNUAL REPORT AD HOC COMMITTEE TO REVIEW AND APPROVE THE CONTENTS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ANNUAL REPORT AND MAKE ANY NECESSARY REVISIONS WITH INPUT FROM APPROPRIATE COUNTY STAFF.

#### THE MOTION CARRIED.

Commissioner Brandenburg felt that his issue should go back to committee and a proposal should go out. She is voting NO.

Commissioner Hill introduced Ben Giampetroni who then read a memorandum dated November 17, 1994 regarding a Request to Change Bid.

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Hill, supported by Commissioner Switalski, to substitute Motion #1 for the Motion in the Memorandum of November 17th.

# 1. COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION - AS AMENDED

THAT THE MACOMB COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP'S) TO POTENTIAL FIRMS FOR A SPRING 1995 AERIAL PHOTOGRAPHY REFLIGHT. FURTHER, THAT AFTER THE EVALUATION OF RESPONSES THAT A RECOMMENDATION BE MADE TO THE PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE AND/OR TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

Commissioner Sowerby questioned why this was not brought up at the meeting.

Vote was taken on the COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION, AS AMENDED and the MOTION CARRIED.

The Clerk read the recommendations of the Finance Committee and a MOTION was made by Chairman Slinde, supported by Vice-Chairman Chrzanowski, to adopt the committee recommendations as follows:

Commissioner Brandenburg reiterated her NO votes at committee level.

# BUDGET - November 22, 1994

The Clerk read the recommendations of the Budget Committee and a MOTION was made by Chairperson Kolakowski, supported by Commissioner Biernat, to adopt the committee recommendations.

Commissioner Brandenburg asked for a separation of Motions #2, #7 and #11.

Vote was taken on the following recommendations:

1. APPROVE SUBMISSION OF THE 1995 MARINE SAFETY PROGRAM APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES (DNR) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$517,652 WHICH IS 75% STATE-FUNDED AND 25% COUNTY-FUNDED AND IS FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 1995 - DECEMBER 31, 1995.

Commissioner Kolakowski stated that a submission of the grant would go back to committee and would go through the bid process.

Commissioner Sessa indicated that any piece of equipment that needs to be purchased should go through the bid process.

- 3. CONCUR IN THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE LAS COMMITTEE TO APPROVE THE ACQUISITION OF MIS 4GL SOFTWARE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE MIS DIRECTOR DATED SEPTEMBER 29 1994, AT A COST OF \$183,287.00 WITH ANNUAL MAINTENANCE FEE OF \$30,156.00 IN THE FOLLOWING YEARS.
- 4. CONCUR IN THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE TO APPROVE THE EXCHANGE OF SERVICES (AGREEMENT) BETWEEN MSU EXTENSION AND THE WIC PROGRAM WHEREBY NUTRITION EDUCATION IS PROVIDED TO WIC CLIENTS ON A MONTHLY BASIS FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR AND SUCCEEDING YEARS FOR A COST, CURRENTLY \$12,000.

- CONCUR IN THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMITTEE TO AUTHORIZE MSU EXTENSION SERVICE TO ACCEPT \$10,000 FEDERAL DOLLARS FROM THE COMMUNITY SERVICES AGENCY, HEADSTART PROGRAM, PROVIDING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS TO HEADSTART PARENTS FOR THE 1994/95 FISCAL YEAR AND AUTHORIZE THE RENEWAL OF THE ACCEPTANCE OF SUBSEQUENT YEARS AS EACH AGENCY AGREES.
- 6. CONCUR IN THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE PLANNING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE TO APPROVE THE MID-RANGE JOINT TRAINING OPTION FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND AUTHORIZE THE DIRECTOR OF THE MACOMB COUNTY COMMUNITY SERVICES AGENCY TO PROCEED WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION. THE MOTION CARRIED, WITH SESSA VOTING NO.

Commissioner Sessa is voting NO on Item #6.

- 8. APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE RETIREMENT COMMISSION TO ALLOCATE A 1994 SUPPLEMENTAL RETIREMENT PAYMENT OF \$295,000 TO RETIREES OF RECORD AS OF 12/31/93. THE MOTION CARRIED, WITH ONE ABSTENTION (PETITTO).
- 9. AUTHORIZE HOLDING AN "AWARDS BREAKFAST" IN HONOR OF THE NACO ACHIEVEMENT AWARD WINNERS ON DECEMBER 2, 1994; AND APPROVE THE EXPENDITURE OF \$800.00 FROM THE 1994 CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE BREAKFAST TO PARTICIPANTS AND GUESTS, AS PRESENTED IN THE MEMO OF NOVEMBER 15, 1994 FROM MARK STEENBERGH, CHAIRMAN, MACOMB COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.
- 10. APPROVE THE TRANSFER OF \$216,000 FROM THE 1994 CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO THE 1994 CIRCUIT COURT BUDGET LINE-ITEMS DEFENSE ATTORNEY FEES AND TRANSCRIPTS AS OUTLINED IN THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT'S LETTER DATED NOVEMBER 15, 1994. THE MOTION CARRIED.

Commissioner Sessa said that the Circuit Court has consistently voted against the use of beepers for the jurors. Upset that the Circuit Court will not try to cut spending with the beeper system. He is voting NO.

Commissioner DeSaele commented about other jurisdictions using beepers for the jury system. Asked Commissioner DiMaria to put this on the agenda.

Commissioner DiMaria indicated that the Chief Judge is not pleased with the system. He would look into other methods of contact.

#### THE MOTION CARRIED.

#### 2. SEPARATED MOTION

APPROVE THE SHERIFF'S PROPOSAL TO INCREASE JAIL CAPACITY BY 120 FOR NON-COUNTY INMATE HOUSING BY DOUBLE-BUNKING AS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS ON NOVEMBER 17, 1994; AND AUTHORIZE RENOVATION OF SAID CELLS BY DEMARIA BUILDING COMPANY AT A COST OF \$63,000 - PROGRAM AS OUTLINED IN THE FINANCE DIRECTOR'S CORRESPONDENCE DATED NOVEMBER 18, 1994; FURTHER, THAT THE SHERIFF REPORT BACK FOUR MONTHS AFTER THE ADDITIONAL INMATES ARRIVE REGARDING THE DETAILS OF THE ADDITIONAL LIABILITY INVOLVING OVERTIME AND MEDICAL COSTS.

Commissioner DiMaria stated for the record that he has no affiliation with DeMaria Building Company.

Commissioner Sessa questioned Civil Counsel as to whether or not there was still a court case pending with the DeMaria Company and the County of Macomb. He proposed that this might create a problem of \$63,000 being paid with this case going on. Corporation Counsel stated that this item is unrelated because that had to do with air conditioning.

Commissioner Brandenburg was concerned about the overtime being reported from the Sheriff's Department. She wanted this issue referred back to committee. This renovation should be bid out.

A MOTION was made by Commissioner DeSaele, supported by Commissioner Brandenburg, to send this Motion back to the committee level.

Commissioner DeSaele stated that since there is a lawsuit with this company, why would the Board of Commissioners hire them to do anything else. Why risk going back to court?

Commissioner Kolakowski is against the Referral Motion because of litigation including the fire alarm system. DeMaria has handled double-bunking on other portions of the jail, we have an idea of how much this would cost. She felt that this issue should not be delayed.

Commissioner Hertel is against Referral Motion. Stated that if we have the space we should use it, if we are not going to use it, then let someone especially if they are going to pay for it. The County is losing \$75,000 a month as long as this procedure isn't done. Urging a NO vote on the Referral Motion.

Commissioner Slinde urged a vote against postponement. We cannot afford to waste money.

Commissioner Burdi stated that he felt reluctant to make a record that stands on data to say that we can't afford to do this, we can't afford to do it by bidding. The presentation made by the Sheriff and Finance Director made reference to the fact this was an extension of DeMaria's previous installation of double bunks in the jail. That record is more consistent in the proposal that is before us than a record that indicates the County being in a hurry for financial purposes. He does not feel this is correct. The Sheriff let it be known there had been no problems with DeMaria's previous double-bunking installation.

A vote was taken on the REFERRAL MOTION to refer this back to committee and the MOTION FAILED.

Vote was taken on the SEPARATED MOTION and the MOTION CARRIED with Commissioner Brandenburg voting NO.

# 7. SEPARATED MOTION

APPROVE THE TRANSFER OF \$10,000 FROM THE SALARY LINE ITEM IN THE MEDICAL EXAMINER PROGRAM TO PURCHASE FURNITURE AND EQUIPMENT NEEDED TO EXPAND AND RELOCATE THE OFFICE WITHIN THE MT. CLEMENS HEALTH CENTER. THE MOTION CARRIED, WITH BRANDENBURG VOTING "NO".

Commissioner Brandenburg does not see that \$10,000 should come out of the Medical Examiners salary for furniture. We already have furniture and computers sitting at the warehouse.

Commissioner Burdi indicated that extensive steps that were made to transfer funds into this Medical Examiner Program, and he found this to be odd to take money from the Medical Examiner. Money should come from a different location.

Vote was taken on the <u>SEPARATED MOTION</u> and the <u>MOTION CARRIED</u> with Commissioners Burdi, Rocca and Brandenburg voting NO.

### 11. SEPARATED MOTION

RECOMMEND THE FOURTH ALTERNATE ECONOMIC ASSUMPTION AS SHOWN ON PAGE 28 OF THE ACTUARY REPORT (7.5% INTEREST AND 5.0% SALARY BASE) AND FORWARD THIS RECOMMENDATION TO THE RETIREMENT COMMISSION FOR ADOPTION IN CALCULATING FUTURE COUNTY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM; IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED THAT ANY FUTURE SAVINGS ACCRUING TO THE COUNTY AS A RESULT OF THIS RECOMMENDATION BE EARMARKED TO FUND THE EXISTING UNFUNDED LIABILITY FOR RETIREE MEDICAL BENEFITS. THE MOTION CARRIED, WITH BRANDENBURG AND SESSA VOTING "NO".

Commissioner Brandenburg stated that this Motion was not a conservative way to go. She is voting opposed to this.

Vote was taken on the SEPARATED MOTION and the MOTION CARRIED with Commissioner Brandenburg voting NO.

#### RESOLUTIONS AND TRIBUTES

- A MOTION was made by Commissioner Kabacinski, supported by Commissioner Liberato, to adopt the resolutions as follows:
  - Res. No. 94-81 Resolution of the Macomb County Board of Commissioners Asserting the Sovereignty of the State of Michigan under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America. (offered by Commissioners Sessa and DeSaele on behalf of the entire Board of Commissioners).
  - Res. No. 94-82 Resolution Commending Anthony Francesco Orlando for Achieving the Status of Eagle Scout in the Boys Scouts of America. (offered by Commissioner Kuss on behalf of the entire Board of Commissioners).
  - Res. No. 94-83 Resolution for Jere Diebold Retiring after 30 Years with the Roseville Parks & Recreation Department (offered by Switalski; recommended by Budge Committee on 11-22-94).

# THE MOTION CARRIED.

### Item waived to Full Board by Finance Committee Chairperson:

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Switalski, supported by Commissioner Kabacinski, to approve the Recommendation from November 16, 1994 Meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee to Review the County's Insurance Program Regarding Employee Benefits to approve Blue Cross/Blue Shield contract for years 1995, 1996, and 1997.

Commissioner Burdi wants this item referred to Ad Hoc to invite in the respondents who made the proposals have questions answered and explain their proposals. He stated without piercing the corporate veil of the Executive Session came particularly clear that what may be required by the County health program, may already be here in the presentations that were received. Make this award at this time without reviewing the alternate presentations, will not be in the best interest of the County.

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Burdi, supported by Commissioner DeSaele to refer this item to an Ad

Commissioner Kolakowski stated that Blue Cross/Blue Shield was already awarded the contract, the language was the only thing to be approved today.

Commissioner DeSaele explained to other Commissioners that this contract should be re-examined.

Commissioner Switalski indicated that the low bidder was awarded the contract which has a 90-day Escape Clause and fundamental changes can be made in that time. Benefits of this contract include \$30,000 savings in Stop Loss Coverage and \$300,000 in Administration Fees.

Commissioner Brandenburg stated that changes are being discussed. This issue should be re-thought because after January 1st it would cost the County more money.

Commissioner Burdi reiterated comments from the executive session: 1) if signed, this will cost the County more money with the items outlined in the Executive Session; 2) what the County is looking for next year is already in the bid responses. He said weeks ago that you can't make a selection before you invite in those people who submitted proposals in order to elaborate on their proposals to cover the issues that came up in the executive session. Felt this should go back to Ad Hoc and request the hearings within the first ten (10) days in December and digest the responses and make sure factors are in place and bring contract back by the end of the year. Taxpayers and the County's interest to lowest bidder for what is needed. He is in favor of the Referral Motion.

Commissioner Petitto explained that the meeting yesterday did not answer any questions to certain factors. He supports the Referral Motion only for the matter of clarifying some matters that were discussed yesterday. The Ad Hoc Committee bypassed a major committee to the full board not giving the opportunity to the major committee to review all pertinent facts of contract. He resents this was done the way it was. There is no mandate this be in place by January 1st. This contract has enlightened him to review every contract in the future. This contract has brought more confusion/enlightenment to this Board than any other contract.

#### THE REFERRAL MOTION FAILED.

Commissioner Burdi stated, "On the contract the cover sheet needs to be corrected. The cover sheet should say it refers to the amendments that were made previously. Page 5(G) Confidentiality addition to second sentence following B, BC/BSM. BC/BSM further agrees not to unreasonably withhold such information. That amendment referred not only to the information but to the granting of the right of the audit. Its not only the information it's the audit process itself that that reference was made to. The contract is before this body this morning inappropriately. At the Ad Hoc Committee a Motion to Call the Question was taken prior to all Commissioners who had raised their hand to speak for the first time on the item that had not been dealt with. Debate was stopped, and that is not what a Call for Question is supposed to do. The rules of this body provide any/every Commissioner with the right to speak once on every item and that was not followed through at the Ad Hoc Committee. On the contract itself, comments were made that this was the low bidder. The contract that is going to pass this morning, in his opinion, does not marry with the Motion made at the September Board of Commissioners meeting. That Motion was offered by Commissioner Sowerby and supported by Commissioner Swiatkowski, that the Renewal Option II for the fixed cost Administrative Cost of \$11.00/person/month was supposed to be what the contract was. The contract has different prices than that. The contract can't change the specifications or the Motion. Page 8, "C2" - Administrative Charge-shows \$11.00, \$11.39, and \$11.79 and prorated on a weekly basis. If the motion speaks to \$11.00 the contract should either reflect the Motion or that needs to be corrected. Page 6 - General Obligations On The Contract-is that when you hire a professional to do a professional job releasing that firm from the obligation and the necessity of following through on that is not appropriate. This in a sense absolutely releases BC/BS from what they were hired to do. Article 3, Paragraph B, Page 6 - this is the consideration that violates the specifications in the most inappropriate way. The specifications that we offered for bid in the market place did not call for the self-insured individual, which is the County to prepay in order to receive the provider and hospital discounts that we hired a third party administrator to provide. No where in our specifications did we indicate that we had to prepay in order to receive provider and hospital discounts. BC/BS presented themselves to us as a third party administrator able to deliver discounts on provider medical services and hospital services. It did not indicate to us that in order for us to accept delivery we had to prepay. We are a self-insured body. Other providers simply put together a monthly collection of bills submitted and paid them on the first of the following month, a 30-day delay and pay the bills in full. It is not necessary to prepay and anticipate so that you can get lower discounts, that is what you pay \$11.00/month/contract to get from the professional BC/BS. Prepaying in anticipation allows them to make money on the \$11.00. It raises the County's cost. Consequently it is not an award to the lowest bidder in competition with the other people who submitted proposals. The contract is a contradiction in fact. This body does not have the privilege of writing a contract that enhances the specifications, upon which you made award. That's like saying that your going to pay someone more money that what the low bid was and that's what that contract does. We do not necessarily have to pay to get the lowest price. That's what you pay for at \$11.00/month. This is just another way of raising the County's health benefit costs. And it doesn't meet the specifications. This paragraph is impossible. Number (2) says the hospital prepayment reflecting the amount BC/BS determines is necessary for its funding for the prospective hospital reimbursement. That's a blank check, it doesn't even tell you the formula that they want to raise the prepayment. It says you will give us what we tell you. This is not the kind of contract you sign on the peoples' behalf. Not only is it prepayment, its a blank check prepayment. If a decision will be made to sign this particular contract you ought to sign something that protects you a little bit. If your going to violate the specifications upon which the award was made you ought to have at least a formula in it rather them telling you how much to send, or your in arrearage. A contract reads the way a contract reads. If someone has to ask 'Explain this to me', then the contract is not ready for signature. No where in our specifications did it require the County of Macomb to prepay to get hospital discounts. This contract demands it."

Mr. Diegle clarified that the procedure followed currently in the payment of the Blue Cross premium: A wire transfer weekly to Blue Cross/Blue Shield a certain sum of money weekly and reconciled quarterly against the claims paid during the period. Over payment is adjusted to the next quarter and viceversa.

John Haack, Director of Risk Management, felt that millions of dollars will be saved by Blue Cross/Blue Shield.

Commissioner Switalski introduced Mr. Havey which drew up the bid specifications.

Mr. Havey stated that the purpose to go for bids was to improve the costs began in June. Blue Cross/Blue Shield based on the plan we have today, is the lowest bidder. To invite the groups who

proposed bids would be a waste of time and money. The objective of the contract is to have rate and performance guarantees. The \$11.00/employee/month for the first of the year, this will increase 3% in the 2nd year and 3% in the 3rd year. There is a hospital prepayment and Blue Cross/Blue Shield gives hospital discounts, minimum guarantee is 30% down. Blue Cross/Blue Shield prepayment will hold approximately \$200,000-\$300,000/month and quarterly return or collect surplus or shortage, this is a tradeoff. This is a guarantee. The next lowest bidder doubled the price on administrative fees and considerably higher on Stop Loss. Macomb County has approximately a \$7.8 million dollar program going into next year in health benefits. Approximately 30% hospital discount on \$3-4 million dollars is significantly more than the loss of interest that you receive for BC/BS to prepay hospitals so they get that cash flow going. Hospitals live or die on cash flow and they are willing to give discounts. The specifications neither included nor exclude the opportunity of prepayment issues. That was an open tem.

commissioner Burdi asked where in Mr. Havey's executive summary did he recommend BC/BS as the low bidder that he informed the Board of Commissioners that their being the low bidder included \$200,000 pr \$300,000 in prepayment and loss of interest. Mr. Havey indicated this was not part of his Executive summary. And the reference made in the minutes of this Board made in September included some remarks that Commissioner Burdi made on the record as a means of assisting Mr. Havey and one of the remarks commissioner Burdi made incorporated in the minutes very accurately was, "Prepayment of any form be excluded because we are self-insured and do not pay for benefits before they are used. We pay for what we use". This was a specific reference made before this contract was drawn. That prepayment was not n included part of the award to BC/BS as a low bidder. Mr. Havey stated BC/BS is the low bidder. Commissioner Burdi stated if you include hundreds of thousands of dollars in prepayment, you enhance their low bid unfairly to the competition of the others who submitted proposals and there's no question that that enhances their response. Prepayment for a self-insured County was not part of the specifications of the proposals requested. He said in the September meeting on Commissioner Sowerby's notion that prepayment should not be a part of the contract and he felt Mr. Havey outrageously included t because he didn't think anyone would read it. We did not require prepayment. He felt Mr. Havey thought it was included.

commissioner Burdi stated, "The County should give the other respondents an opportunity to fine tune t that way, or its out. What we did agree is to award them in the first year \$11.00/contract/employee to administer claims. And what they guaranteed us for that \$11.00 was access to provider and hospital discounts. It's not necessary for us to buy those discounts twice. And that's what this contract boes. It makes the taxpayers pay twice for the same thing. We did not require prepayment they did not ndicate prepayment. You cannot amend specifications of a proposal by contract no one has that privilege or that prerogative. This contract enhances their award and it enhances it unfairly to the ther respondents. Any body that is self-insured who prepays for discounts is outrageous. contract changes the specifications. Other issues covered included: Page 7, Paragraph 10 - there is ho reference to an audit. Paragraph B another Prepayment Clause, which was not included in the specifications on which the award was made. Page 8 - Settled Claims Quarterly Statements - no audit reference made either. Paragraph 3 - Hospital Discounts - the bid specifications do no refer to the requirement or necessity to prepay in order to receive these discounts. BC/BS presented themselves as professional firm able to handle claims to provide certain discounts. They never said you have to prepay to get them. Paragraph 9 (D) Post Termination - this clause states that when you terminate the contract it automatically extends it three (3) months for the purpose of processing claims that were not received at the time of termination. It says you have to continue to pay the administrative fee for 90 days beyond the point of termination. This should be 90 days or completion of the processing of claims whichever is less. Page 10 - Outstanding Liability - is recalculated at the time of termination. This is unfair. No reference in this contract to the BC/BS agreements made verbally to provide this County for the right of post audits on previously experienced contracts and work. No reference to BC/BS paying for the audits necessary for us to check. We make all of the prepayments and they adjust them quarterly on a monthly based on their internal economics but we don't audit at all. we are doing what they are telling us to do. We asked for monthly activity reports concerning usage of administrative fees, there is no reference in the contract of them providing that. This contract coesn't reflect the specifications it enhances them - nobody has the right to do that." Commissioner Burdi included that he demanded in July to the consultant that the specifications should include a PPO response. This contract doesn't reflect PPO.

Commissioner DeSaele noted that prepayment was never mentioned, supports Commissioner Burdi. She was surprised from corporation counsel allowing the Board of Commissioners to go ahead and sign this contract.

### Item waived to Full Board by Justice and Public Safety Committee Chairman:

A <u>MOTION</u> was made by Commissioner Chrzanowski, supported by Commissioner Kabacinski to approve necessary easements for utilities, water and storm drains for the Macomb County Fire Training Center.

Commissioner Brandenburg stated that there is a lot of water running through the south drain easement area. The college should pay future repairs. If passed today, the college will make repairs on the parking lot on Friday, November 25, 1994. The trees will not be bothered because the berm will protect them. She wants the language "future maintenance" deleted because it is not our responsibility. The County should be more concerned about how much this will cost us.

#### Possible Lease Agreement with State of Michigan at Warren Satellite and VerKuilen Building:

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Kabacinski, supported by Commissioner Swiatkowski, to reject the State offer regarding renovation of the Warren Satellite and VerKuilen Buildings and to propose a counter offer as outlined on the November 10, 1994 correspondence by the Finance Director.

Mr. Diegle asked the Board of Commissioners to reject the formal proposal from the State of Michigan, including the \$100,000 contract with a 5 year payback. He stated that the County occupies 40% of that building and we would get a brand new air handling system. \$225,000 with a 15 year payback is too much. Macomb County will try and protect themselves as much as possible.

He was concerned with Mr. Wahby being the Mayor of St. Clair Shores and the Treasurer of Macomb County and the conflict it would created if he were to be appointed.

Commissioner Liberato reiterated the Constitution of 1963 stated that a person can only have one elected position. Mr. Wahby would have to retire as St. Clair Shores Mayor if appointed as Treasurer.

Commissioner Steenbergh indicated that Commissioner Kolakowski will get an Equalization Report.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE MANDATED BY LAW, THAT ALL FEES AND PER DIEMS COLLECTED BY THE COUNTY CLERK/REGISTER OF DEEDS, THE COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY, THE COUNTY SHERIFF, THE COUNTY TREASURER AND THE COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSIONER OR THEIR DEPUTIES OR DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES BE TURNED OVER TO THE COUNTY TREASURER FOR DEPOSIT IN THE GENERAL FUND OF THE COUNTY OF MACOMB.

A vote was taken on the <u>SEPARATED RESOLUTION</u>, and the <u>SEPARATED RESOLUTION CARRIED</u>, with Commissioners Rocca, Brandenburg, and DiMaria voting NO.

### SEPARATED RESOLUTION:

Res. No. 94-93 Resolution which fixes the 1995 and 1996 Compensation of Road Commissioners (recommended by Personnel Committee on 12/16/94)

Commissioner Hill questioned why there are two separate resolutions for Compensation. He stated that this is still taxpayer funds. Salaries were reported in the Macomb Daily on December 18, 1994 showing that the Board of Commissioners will have a 2.5% increase in 1995 and another in 1996. This Resolution is different than what has been printed. Discussing COLA is bad public policy. Shouldn't have uneven COLA costs in the County. He is voting NO.

Corporation Counsel indicated that one is for elected officials and one is for appointed officials. They both come from different fund sources.

Mr. Diegle explained that the Road Commissioners get COLA at the rate of \$5.42/hour and the Board of Commissioners and other County employees receive COLA at the rate of \$.20/hour.

Commissioner Biernat indicated that this is hypocritical to vote for this.

Commissioner Kolakowski felt that salaries are paid adequately as it is, they don't deserve \$5.42/hour COLA rate.

Commissioner Liberato stated that COLA for the Road Commission was negotiated 20 years ago. COLA was rolled into their base pay, it's been this way for years as a fringe benefit. If other Commissioners do not like how the Road Commissioners get their jobs, then change their qualifications and eligibility.

A MOTION was made by Commissioner Switalski, supported by Commissioner Kabacinski, to AMEND SECTION A of this Resolution to leave the salaries for 1995 and 1996 without the 2.5% increase.

Commissioner Switalski indicated that the Macomb County Road Commissioners are over paid compared to other areas of the state.

Commissioner Petitto is voting opposed to Section A.

Commissioner Sessa is voting opposed to Paragraph C.

Commissioner Brandenburg felt that the Road Commissioners deserve the raise just like anyone else.

Commissioner Liberato felt that cuts should be made across the board, not just the Commissioners.
