WHEREAS, Pursuant to petition filed by the City of Warren, Macomb County, Michigan, pursuant to Chapter 20 of the Drain Code, with the Public Works Commissioner of the County of Macomb, proceedings have been carried out by the Statutory Drainage Board of the County of Macomb for the financing and construction of an intracounty drainage project designated as WARREN SANITARY DRAIN, said project having been determined to be necessary for the public health; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said proceedings, Special Assessment Roll No. 1 has been prepared and duly confirmed by the Drainage Board in the aggregate principal amount of \$7,950,000, being the amount of total estimated financed share cost of the project, which assessments are payable in annual installments over a period of nineteen (19) years, commencing December 1, 1990, by the City of Warren according to apportionments duly determined by the Drainage Board, as follows:

City of Warren - 100%

said installments bearing interest at such rate of interest as may be necessary to pay interest on obligations payable therefrom; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authorization provided in the Drain Code, the Drainage Board, by resolution, has authorized and provided for the issuance of bonds payable from the collection of said special assessments against the City of Warren on said Roll, said bonds being designated WARREN SANITARY DRAIN DRAINAGE DISTRICT, DRAINAGE DISTRICT BONDS in the aggregate principal amount of \$7,950,000, dated as of December 1, 1989, bearing interest at a maximum rate of 12% per annum and maturing serially from January 1, 1991, to January 1, 2009, to provide funds to pay costs of the project; and,

WHEREAS, The said drainage project is immediately necessary to protect and preserve the public health, and it is to the best interest of the County of Macomb that the said bonds, in order to be sold at the lowest and most favorable interest cost possible to obtain, be secured by a pledge of the full faith and credit of the County, as authorized by the provisions of said Drain Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF MACOMB, MICHIGAN:

That pursuant to the authorization provided in the Drain Code the Board of Commissioners of the County of Macomb does hereby irrevocably pledge the full faith and credit of the County of Macomb for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the aforesaid bonds when due, and pursuant to said pledge, in the event that the aforesaid Drainage District shall fail or neglect to pay the aforesaid bonds or interest thereon when due, the amount unpaid shall be promptly advanced from County funds as a first budget obligation, and the County Treasurer is directed to immediately make such advancement to the extent necessary.

2. That in the event that pursuant to said pledge of its full faith and credit the County of Macomb advances out of County funds all or any part of said installments and interest, it shall be the duty of the County Treasurer, for and on behalf of the County of Macomb, to take all actions and proceedings and pursue all remedies permitted or authorized by law for the reimbursement of such sums so paid.

3. The Public Works Commissioner of the County of Macomb is hereby authorized to notify the Michigan Department of Treasury of the County's intent to pledge its full faith and credit as secondary security for the \$7,950,000 Warren Sanitary Drain Drainage District, Drainage District Bonds, to pay the related fee and to request an order providing an exception for the bonds from prior approval by the Department of Treasury.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the 100% Tax Payment Fund is to provide a source of monies from which the Treasurer may pay any or all delinquent real property taxes which are due the County, any school district, intermediate school district, community college district, city, township, special assessment or drainage district, or any other political unit for which delinquent tax payments are due on settlement day with the Treasurer or any city or township treasurer, and the Treasurer has been directed to make such payments by the Board of Commissioners of this County; and,

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Treasurer has advised the Macomb County Board of Commissioners that there are sufficient monies in the Macomb County Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund to establish the 1990 100% Tax Payment Fund.

WHEREAS, the County Agency has recommended to this Board that the project be given tentative approval and that the County Agency be authorized to undertake initial steps toward the financing and construction of the project, subject, however, to certain conditions;

3. The County Agency shall employ the following consultants in connection with the project:

As financial consultant: Bendzinski & Co.
Detroit, Michigan

As engineers: Anderson, Eckstein & Westrick
Mt. Clemens, Michigan

4. The said Village shall undertake to provide by contract for the payment of all costs of retiring the necessary financing and shall further undertake to reimburse the County for all expenses incurred in connection with the project should the financing and construction of the project not be completed for any reason whatsoever.

5. This Board hereby estimates the total cost of constructing the improvements to be \$500,000, including all engineering fees, financing costs and contingencies, such estimate subject, however, to revision upon submission of final cost estimates or receipt of bids for the project.

6. All agreements between the County Agency and the aforesaid Village shall be subject to final approval and ratification by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Macomb.

7. The County Agency is hereby authorized to notify the Michigan Department of Treasury of the County's intent to issue the bonds described herein, to pay the related fee and to request an order providing an exception for the bonds from prior approval by the Department of Treasury.

8. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same hereby are rescinded.

WHEREAS, pursuant to said proceedings, Special Assessment Roll No. 1 has been prepared and duly confirmed by the Drainage Board in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,725,000, being the amount of total estimated financed share cost of the project, which assessments are payable in annual installments over a period of fourteen (14) years, commencing April 1, 1992, by the City of Sterling Heights according to apportionments duly determined by the Drainage Board, as follows:

City of Sterling Heights 100% said installments bearing interest at such rate of interest as may be necessary to pay interest on obligations payable therefrom; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authorization provided in the Drain Code, the Drainage Board, by resolution, has authorized and provided for the issuance of bonds payable from the collection of said special assessments against the City of Sterling Heights on said Roll, said bonds being designated BURR RELIEF NO. 2 DRAIN DRAINAGE DISTRICT, DRAINAGE DISTRICT BONDS (Limited Tax General Obligation) in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,725,000, dated as of August 1, 1990, bearing interest at a maximum rate of 12% per annum and maturing serially from May 1, 1992, to May 1, 2005, to provide funds to pay costs of the project; and,

3. Said replacement coupons shall be in substantially the form of the original Coupons, except the coupons shall include an endorsement in substantially the following form:

"Replacement"

The replacement coupons shall be executed in the same manner and by officers holding the same office as the officers who executed the original Coupons.

4. Said replacement obligations and coupon payment shall only be delivered after payment is made to cover the costs of preparation of the replacement obligations and all other costs incurred by the Issuer and the Paying Agent in connection with the issuance and delivery of the replacement obligations and of payment without presentation of the Coupons.

5. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same are hereby rescinded.

RES. NO. 2467 - A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO DEFRAY THE COSTS OF CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE MACOMB COUNTY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM NO. 11 (VILLAGE OF NEW HAVEN); AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF SUCH IMPROVEMENTS; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE TO SAID CONSTRUCTION AND SAID BONDS.

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the County of Macomb, Michigan, by resolution of its Board of Commissioners, adopted the provisions of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, and pursuant to said resolution the County Public Works Commissioner of the County of Macomb as the duly designated agency of the County has constructed and maintained systems of water improvements and related equipment and appurtenances in connection therewith;

AND WHEREAS, to preserve and protect the public health, safety and welfare of the present and future residents of the Village hereafter named, which in turn will be for the benefit of the general health, safety and welfare of the entire County of Macomb, it is necessary to meet an imperative and urgent need for water supply improvements in said Village to make available to citizens and residents thereof improved water supply services, which said improvements are generally described in the contract hereinafter set forth;

AND WHEREAS, in order to finance costs of said improvements, it is deemed advisable to proceed under the authorization contained in Sections 5a, 5b and 5c of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, and the resolution heretofore referred to;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to said statutory authorization, the County of Macomb, by its County Public Works Commissioner as the duly designated County Agency, and the aforesaid Village have executed a contract providing for the construction and financing of such improvements as a part of the Macomb County Water Supply System No. 11 (Village of New Haven) and for other details in connection with such financing and construction, said contract being as attached hereto in full and made a part of this resolution;

AND WHEREAS, all things necessary to the authorization and issuance of bonds pursuant to the provisions of law, particularly Sections 51, 5b and 5c of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, have been done, and the County of Macomb is now empowered and desires to authorize the issuance of such bonds;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF MACOMB THIS 26TH DAY OF JULY, 1990, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Definitions. Wherever used in this resolution or in the bonds to be issued hereunder, except where otherwise indicated by the context:

(a) The term "County" shall be construed to mean the County of Macomb, Michigan.

(b) The Term "Local Unit" shall be construed to mean the Village of New Haven, County of Macomb, Michigan.

(c) The term "Act" shall be construed to mean Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended.

(d) The Term "County Agency" shall be construed to mean the Public Works Commissioner of the County.

(e) The term "Project" shall be construed to mean the water supply improvements to be acquired and constructed, as referred to in the preamble to this resolution and the contract attached hereto.

(f) The term "Contract" shall be construed to mean the contract heretofore made and executed between the County, by its duly designedd County Agency, and the Local Unit, as set forth in the preamble hereto.

(g) The term "Contractual Payments" shall be construed to mean the installment payments as required to be made by the Local Unit to the County pursuant to the provisions of Section 10 of the Contract and pledged for the payment of principal and interest on the bonds to be issued.

Section 2. Establishment of System. The Board of Commissioners of the County does hereby approve the establishment of a water supply system for the Local Unit in the County, known as MACOMB COUNTY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM NO. 11 (VILLAGE OF NEW HAVEN) (the "System"), for the supply, purification and distribution of potable water in the district hereinafter described, the System at present to consist of a water main linking the Detroit water supply to the existing water distribution facilities of the Local Unit, together with all necessary and related appurtenances, attachments, works, instrumentalities, rights in land and properties used or useful in connection with the operation of a water supply system in the area comprising said district as hereinafter described. The system and the area to be served thereby shall encompass the following territory:

MUNICIPALITY:	VILLAGE OF NEW HAVEN
Area to be served by System	Entire Village water service area

Section 3. Construction of Project. The project to be located within the Local Unit, as generally described in the Contract and in the maps and plans filed with the County Agency, is hereby approved as a County project to be acquired, constructed, operated and financed under the provisions of the Act.

Section 4. Approval of Plans and Estimates; Determination of Necessity. The plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the Project preliminarily prepared by the engineers specified in the Contract are hereby accepted and approved, and it is hereby determined to be necessary, for the public health of the County, to acquire, construct and complete said Project, as provided in said plans and specifications, under the supervision and direction of the County Agency.

Section 5. Approval of Contract. The Contract between the County, by its duly designated County Agency, and the Local Unit, as attached hereto, is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.

Section 6. Estimated Cost and Estimated Period of Usefulness. The total cost of acquiring and constructing said Project, including the payment of incidental expenses specified in Section 6 hereof, which total estimated cost is \$495,000, is hereby approved and confirmed, and the estimated period of usefulness of the Project is determined to be not less than forty (40) years.

Section 7. Issuance of Bonds. For the purpose of paying costs of construction of the Project, including payment of engineering, legal and financing expenses, there be borrowed the sum of Four Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$495,000) and that in evidence thereof there be issued the bonds of the County as hereinafter set forth.

Section 8. Bond Terms. Said bonds shall be designated MACOMB COUNTY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM NO. 11 (VILLAGE OF NEW HAVEN) BONDS (LIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION), the principal of and interest thereon to be payable primarily out of the Contractual Payments required to be paid by the Local Unit pursuant to the Contract. Said bonds shall be registered as to principal and interest of the denomination of \$5,000 or multiples of \$5,000 up to the amount of a single maturity, numbered consecutively in order of authentication from 1 upwards, callable prior to maturity as hereinafter provided, dated as of July 1, 1990, and shall be payable annually on May 1 of each year as follows:

The bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates determined on sale thereof, not exceeding a rate or net interest cost of twelve percent (12%) per annum, with a discount of not to exceed two percent (2%), payable on November 1, 1990, and semiannually thereafter, by check drawn on the transfer agent mailed to the registered owner at the registered address, as shown on the registration books of the County maintained by the transfer agent. Interest shall be payable to the registered owner of record as of the 15th day of the month prior to the payment date for each interest payment. The date of determination of registered owner for purposes of payment of interest as provided in this paragraph may be changed by the County to conform to market practice in the future. The principal of the bonds shall be payable at such bank or trust company as may be designated by the County Agency as registrar/ transfer/paying agent for this issue.

Section 9. Execution and Delivery of Bonds. The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute said bonds by means of their facsimile signatures when issued and sold for and on behalf of the County and to imprint a facsimile of the seal of the County thereon. No bond of this series shall be valid until authenticated by an authorized officer of the transfer agent. The bonds shall be delivered to the transfer agent for authentication and shall then be delivered to the purchaser in accordance with instructions from the Treasurer of the County upon payment of the purchase price for the bonds in accordance with the bid therefor when accepted. Executed blank bonds for registration and issuance to transferees shall simultaneously, and from time to time thereafter as necessary, be delivered to the transfer agent for safekeeping.

Any bond may be transferred upon the books required to be kept pursuant to this section by the person in whose name it is registered, in person or by his duly authorized attorney, upon surrender of the bond for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the transfer agent. Whenever any bond or bonds shall be surrendered for transfer, the transfer agent shall authenticate and deliver a new bond or bonds, for like aggregate principal amount. The transfer agent shall require the payment by the bondholder requesting the transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer.

Section 10. Primary Security for Bonds. The bonds and interest thereon shall be payable primarily from the Contractual Payments received by the County pursuant to the Contract, for the payment of which the Local Unit in the Contract has pledged its full faith and credit pursuant to the provisions of the Act. The Local Unit has covenanted and

agreed to levy taxes to the extent necessary to provide funds to meet the Contractual Payments as they become due under the provisions of the Contract, subject to charger, statutory and constitutional limitations. As provided in Section 6, Article IX of the constitution of the State of Michigan, the bonds herein authorized are being issued in anticipation of the Contractual Payments to be made by the Local Unit under the Contract, such Contractual Payments being "contract obligations in anticipation of which bonds are issued" within the purview of said Section of the Constitution.

Section 11. Debt Retirement Fund. It shall be the duty of the County Agency, after the adoption of this resolution and the sale of the bonds herein authorized, to open a special depository account to be designed DEBT RETIREMENT FUND - MACOMB COUNTY WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM NO. 11 (VILLAGE OF NEW HAVEN) BONDS (Hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Debt Retirement Fund"), into which account it shall be the duty of the County Agency to deposit, as received, the Contractual Payments required to be made by the Local Unit pursuant to the Contract, any payments made by the County pursuant to the provisions of Section 12 of this resolution, any advance payments made by the Local Unit, or any additional moneys paid by the Local Unit to be used for purchasing bonds for retirement prior to maturity. The moneys from time to time on hand in said Debt Retirement Fund shall be used solely and only for the payment of the interest of and principal on the bonds herein authorized.

Section 12. Secondary Security for Bonds. Pursuant to authorization provided in the Act, the full faith and credit of the County is hereby pledged for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on all of said bonds as the same shall become due. If for any reason there are not sufficient funds on hand from the Contractual Payments pledged to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due, as specified herein and in the Contract, upon written notification by the County Agency to the County Treasurer of the County of the Amount of such deficiency, the County Treasurer shall promptly, out of County funds, deposit into the Debt Retirement Fund the amount of such deficiency, and if necessary for such payment, the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the County, subject to statutory and constitutional limitations. If it becomes necessary for the County to so advance such moneys, it shall have such right or rights of reimbursement and any and all remedies therefor as provided by the Act or any other law. The County recognizes and covenants that its full faith and credit pledge herein is a first budget obligation.

Section 13. Bond Form. The bonds shall be in substantially the following form:

Section 14. Additional Bonds. Nothing contained in this resolution or the Contract shall be construed to prevent the County from issuing additional bonds in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Michigan for the purpose of financing water facilities authorized by law, but such bonds shall in no way have any lien or or be payable out of the contractual Payments pledged to the payment of the bonds of this authorized issue, unless additional bonds are issued to complete the Project, as authorized by the provisions of the Contract.

Section 15. Contract with Bondholders. The provisions of this resolution, together with the Contract attached hereto, shall constitute a contract between the County and the holder or holders of the bonds from time to time, and after the issuance of such bonds, no change, variation or alteration of the provisions of this resolution and the Contract may be made which would lessen the security for the bonds. The provisions of this resolution and the Contract shall be enforceable by appropriate proceedings taken by such holder under the law.

Section 16. and Covenants of County. The County covenants and agrees with the successive holders of the bonds that so long as any of the bonds remain outstanding unpaid as to either principal or interest as follows:

(a) The County and the County Agency will punctually perform all of its obligations and duties under this resolution and the Contract herein set forth, and will collect, segregate and apply the Contractual Payments and other moneys paid by the Local Unit or by the County, in the manner required under this resolution and the Contract.

(b) The County will promptly and punctually perform all of its legal obligations and duties relative to the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds by virtue of the pledge of its full faith and credit for the payment thereof under the terms of this resolution.

(c) The County and the County Agency will apply and use the proceeds of sale of the bonds in the manner required by the provisions of this resolution and the Contract.

(d) The County and the County Agency will maintain and keep proper books of record and account relative to the application of funds for the construction of the Project and the Contractual Payments and other moneys received from the Local Unit or advanced by the County. Not later than three (3) months after the end of each year, the County shall cause to be prepared a statement, in reasonable detail, sworn to by its chief accounting officer, showing the application of the proceeds of sale of the bonds, the cash receipts from the Local Unit or County during such year and the application thereof, and such other information as may be necessary to enable any taxpayer or any holder or owner of the bonds, or anyone acting in their behalf, to be fully informed as to all matters pertaining to the construction of the Project and application of funds therefor, or for the payment of the bonds during such year. A certified copy of said statement shall be filed with the County Clerk of the County and the Clerk of the Local Unit, and a copy shall also be sent to the manager or managers of the account purchasing the bonds.

(e) The County agrees that it will take or abstain from taking all actions required by the federal Internal Revenue Code and regulations thereunder as may be necessary to retain for the interest on the bonds the exemption from direct federal income taxation, including specifically all actions and abstention from actions as required by the Non-Arbitrage and Tax Compliance Certificate and related documents furnished in connection with the bonds.

Section 17. Proceeds of Bond Sale; Investment. The proceeds of sale of the bonds herein authorized, except a sum equal to the accrued interest and premium, if any, received upon delivery of the bonds, which sum shall be deposited into the Debt Retirement Fund, shall be used by the County solely and only to pay costs of construction of the Project, including all engineering, legal, financing and other expenses incident thereto. Pending utilization of said funds for said purposes, said moneys, as nearly as may be practicable, shall be invested, reinvested and deposited as permitted by Michigan law, which investments and deposits shall mature, or which shall be subject to redemption by the holder thereof at the option of the holder, not later than the respective dates, as estimated by the County Agency, when such moneys will be required to pay costs of construction of the Project. Said investments and deposits shall be selected by the County Agency. Interest realized from such investments or deposits shall be considered as additional moneys for construction. Any surplus construction moneys remaining after completion of the Project shall be used in accordance with the provisions therefor

specified in the Contract.

Section 18. Duties of County Agency re Sale of Bonds. The County Agency is hereby designated, for and on behalf of the county, to (a) prepare and submit application to the Michigan Department of Treasury for its approval of the issuance of said bonds and the form of notice of sale, as required by law, or alternatively for an order of exception from prior approval, in the latter event together with payment of the required fee; (b) arrange for sale of the bonds, prepare form of notice of sale, fix a date of sale, conduct the sale, and accept the best bid received at such sale; (c) publish notice of sale in an authorized newspaper at least seven (7) full days prior to the date fixed for sale; and (d) to do all other acts and take all other actions and other necessary procedures required to effectuate a sale and delivery of the bonds, including, if appropriate, reducing the amount of bonds sold and/or delivered if the county Agency determines that the full amount thereof is not necessary to complete the Project.

Section 19. Call of Bonds. The bonds are subject to redemption prior to maturity at the times and prices and in the manner set forth in this resolution. Unless waived by any registered owner of bonds to be redeemed, official notice of redemption shall be given by the transfer agent on behalf of the County. Such notice shall be dated and shall contain at a minimum the following information; original issue date; maturity dates; interest rates; CUSIP numbers, if any; certificate numbers (and in the case of partial redemption the called amount of each certificate); the redemption date; the redemption price or premium; the place where bonds called for redemption are to be surrendered for payment; and that interest on bonds or portions thereof called for redemption shall cease to accrue from and after the redemption date. In addition, further notice shall be given by the transfer agent in such manner as may be required or suggested by regulations or market practice at the applicable time, but no defect in such further notice shall in any manner defeat the effectiveness of a call for redemption if notice thereof is given as prescribed herein.

WHEREAS, the United States of America would not be the free, strong, wonderful Country it is today without our men and women who have dedicated their lives to ensure this freedom and strength we so dearly enjoy today, and,

WHEREAS, COLONEL DONALD E. ODELL enlisted in the United States Air Force on September 6, 1952 and served in the enlisted status until April, 1954, at which time he entered the Aviation Cadet Pilot Training Program, receiving his commission and wings on August 1, 1955; and served as an instructor pilot in the Air Force Pilot Training School from 1955 to 1958, and,

WHEREAS, COLONEL DONALD E. ODELL served a tour in fighters in Europe from 1959 to 1962 and in 1966 he received his assignment to F-105 fighter-bombers, and,

WHEREAS, the said COLONEL DONALD E. ODELL arrived at the 34th Tactical Fighter Squadron, Korat Air Base, Thailand in August, 1967, and was shot down on his 17th mission on October 17, 1967, sixteen miles northeast of Hanoi, North Vietnam and after enduring tremendous hardships, was released from Prisoner of War status March 14, 1973 and returned home April 7, 1973 after being hospitalized and is presently employed at Selfridge Air National Guard Base as the Base Public Affairs Officer, and,

WHEREAS, all the citizens of the United States especially those in the County of Macomb are extremely proud of COLONEL DONALD E. ODELL and of all the awards and decorations he received upon release from prison of war status; these are: the Silver Star, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal for Valor with Oak Leaf Cluster, Purple Heart with Oak Leaf Cluster, Air Force Commendation Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with 11 bronze Battle Stars, and,
