WHEREAS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners wishes to update and amend its prior resolution establishing a County Emergency Management Policy and Organization; and

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners wishes to define the duties and responsibilities of the Emergency Management Coordinator and other personnel; and,

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners wishes to authorize the use of the material resources and manpower of the County in emergency operations; and,

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners wishes to prevent, minimize and relieve damage to persons and property resulting from any disaster or emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS:

Article 1. Intent and Purpose

Section 101. It is the intent and purpose of this resolution to establish an organization that will insure the complete and efficient utilization of all county resources during periods of emergency and disaster.

Section 102. The Macomb County Office of Emergency Management will be the coordinating agency responsible for county-wide emergency management and disaster preparedness; it will provide the means through which the Board of Commissioners and its Chairperson may exercise the authority and discharge the responsibilities vested in them by this resolution and Act No. 390, Public Acts of 1976 and as amended by Act No. 50, Public Acts of 1990.

Section 103. This resolution will not relieve any elected officials or county departments of the normal responsibilities or authority given by general law or local ordinance, nor will it affect the work of the American Red Cross or other volunteer agencies organized for relief in a disaster or emergency.

Article 2. Definitions

Section 201. For the purpose of this resolution, certain words used herein are defined as follows:

- a. "Board" shall mean the Macomb County Board of Commissioners.
- b. "Chairperson" shall mean the Chairperson of the County Board of Commissioners.
- c. "Coordinator" shall mean the responsible head of the Macomb County Office of Emergency Management, appointed as prescribed in this resolution. (For personnel purposes within the County of Macomb, this position is identified as Coordinator, Office of Emergency Services.)
- d. "Disaster" means occurrence or threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or human-made cause, including but not limited to, fire, flood, snowstorm, ice storm, tornado, windstorm, wave action, oil spills, water contamination, utility failure, hazardous peacetime radiological incident, major transportation accident, hazardous materials incident, epidemic, air contamination, blight, drought, infestation, explosion or hostile military or paramilitary action, or similar occurrences resulting from terrorist activities, riots or civil disorders.
- e. "District Coordinator" means the State Police Emergency management division district coordinator.
- f. "Emergency" means any occasion or instance in which the Governor determines State assistance is needed to supplement local efforts and capabilities to save lives, protect property and the public health and safety, or to lessen or avert the threat of a catastrophe in any part of the State.
- g. "Emergency Operations Plan" means the Macomb County Emergency Operations Plan which has been prepared under Section 602 of this resolution to coordinate disaster response and recovery within Macomb County.
- h. "Emergency Services" shall have a broad meaning to include preparations for, and relief from, the effects of natural and man-made disasters as defined herein, and to include Civil Defense.

i. "Emergency Management Forces" means all disaster relief forces; all agencies of the County government, private and volunteer personnel, public officers and employees; and all other persons or groups of persons having duties or responsibilities under this resolution or pursuant to a lawful order or directive authorized by this resolution.

j. "Emergency Services Volunteer" shall mean any person duly registered and appointed by the Coordinator and assigned to participate in the Emergency Services activities.

k. "Emergency Situation" means any situation confronting a community requiring emergency actions of a lesser nature than a disaster, as defined above, to include but not limited to, civil disturbances, labor strikes, visits by national or international dignitaries, and build-up activities prior to an actual disaster.

l. "Local State of Emergency" means a declaration by the Chairperson pursuant to this resolution which activates the disaster response and recovery aspects of the Macomb County emergency Operations Plan and authorizes the deployment and use of any emergency services forces to which the plan applies.

m. "State of Disaster" means a declaration by executive order of proclamation by the Governor which activates the disaster response and recovery aspects of state, county, local and interjurisdictional disaster emergency plans and authorizes the deployment and uses of any forces to which the plan or plans apply.

n. "State of Emergency" means an executive order or proclamation by the Governor that activates the emergency response and recovery aspects of the state, local and interjurisdictional emergency operations plans applicable to the counties or municipalities affected.

Article 3. Organization for Emergency Services

Section 301. The Chairperson, with the approval of the Board, is hereby authorized and directed to create an organization to prepare for community disasters or emergencies, utilizing to the fullest extent existing agencies within the County. The Chairperson, as executive head of County government, shall be the Director of the Emergency Management Forces of the County and shall be responsible for their organization,

administration and operation, working through the Coordinator.

Section 302. The organization for providing emergency services shall consist of the following:

a. An Office of Emergency Management established within County government. The Office of Emergency Management shall have an administrative head appointed who will be known as the Coordinator, Office of Emergency Management. Such assistants and other employees as are deemed necessary for the proper functioning of the organization will be employed.

b. The employees, equipment and facilities of all County departments, boards, institutions and commissions suitable for, or adaptable to emergency services activities may be designated as part of the total Emergency Management Forces. Such designations shall be by the Chairperson with the approval of the Board.

Section 303. All officers and employees of departments, commissions, boards, institutions and other agencies of County government designated by the Chairperson, with the approval of the Board, as Emergency Management Forces, shall cooperate with the Emergency Management Coordinator in the formulation of the Emergency Operations Plan, and they shall assist the Coordinator in all matters pursuant to the provisions of this resolution.

Article 4. Emergency Management Coordinator; Assistants; Deputies

Section 401. The Chairperson, with the approval of the Board, shall appoint an Emergency Management Coordinator who shall be a person with the personal attributes, experience, and training needed to coordinate the activities of the agencies, departments, and individuals within the County to protect the public health, safety and welfare during emergency situations and disasters.

Section 402. Assistant Coordinators shall be designated to work with the Coordinator on emergency planning matters. There shall be one such Assistant Coordinator appointed from each County department as designated by the department head, with the approval of the Chairperson as part of the Emergency Management Forces.

Section 403. Each city or village in the County for which the County has emergency services responsibilities shall be encouraged to appoint a Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator to work with the County on emergency planning matters and emergency

operations. Such deputies are to provide liaison services between the County and their respective chief executives.

Article 5. Chairperson: Powers; Duties

Section 501. The Chairperson may exercise the emergency power and authority as specified herein. Whenever a situation requires, or is likely to require, that the Chairperson can invoke such power and authority, he/she shall, as soon as reasonably expedient, convene the Board to perform its legislative and administrative duties as the situation demands, and shall report to that body relative to emergency activities. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as abridging or curtailing the powers of the Board unless specifically provided herein.

Section 502. The Chairperson may declare that a local state of emergency exists in Macomb County and may assemble and utilize the Emergency Management Forces in accordance with Macomb County Emergency Operations Plan, and he/she may prescribe the manner and conditions of the use of such Emergency Management Forces. This local state of emergency shall not be continued or renewed for a period in excess of seven days except with the consent of the Board. The declaration shall be promptly filed with the emergency management division of the department, unless circumstances attendant upon the disaster prevent or impede its prompt filing whenever, on the basis of information received from authoritative sources, he feels that a large-scale disaster or emergency situation in the County or State is imminent.

Section 503. Whenever the Chairperson deems that any condition in the County is beyond the control of County public or private agencies or has attained or threatens to attain the proportions of a major disaster or emergency, he/she may act for the Board and request the Governor to declare a state of disaster or state of emergency exists therein by instructing the Coordinator to contact the District Coordinator in accordance with Section 14, Act 390, Public Acts of 1976, as amended by Act 50, Public Acts of 1990. In such case, the Chairperson shall convene the Board as soon as practicable for their affirmative action.

Section 504. The Chairperson, with the approval of the Board, is hereby empowered and has the authority:

a. To appropriate and expend funds, make contracts, obtain and distribute equipment, materials, and supplies for disaster purposes.

b. To provide for the health and safety of persons and property

including emergency assistance to the victims of a disaster or emergency.

c. To assign and make equipment available for duty, the employees, property, or equipment of the County relating to fire fighting; engineering; rescue; health; medical and related services; police; transportation; construction; and similar items or service for disaster or emergency relief purposes within or without the physical limits of the County.

d. In the event of a foreign attack upon this State, to waive procedures and formalities otherwise required by law pertaining to the performance of public work, entering into contracts, the incurring of obligations, the employment of permanent and temporary workers, the utilization of volunteer workers, the rental of equipment, the purchase and distribution with or without compensation of supplies, materials and facilities, and the appropriation and expenditure of public funds.

Section 505. The Chairperson, with the approval of the Board, shall establish procedures for the succession of government during emergencies where officials are unavailable for exercising the powers and discharging the duties of their respective offices.

Section 506. The Chairperson, with the approval of the Board, may make regulations permitting the Coordinator to assemble and utilize the Emergency Management Forces and provide disaster relief aid as prescribed in Sections 502, 503 and 504.

Section 507. When obtaining formal approvals would result in delay of relief activity, the Chairperson may, until the board convenes, waive procedures and formalities otherwise required pertaining to the performance of public works, entering into contracts, the incurring of obligations, the employment of temporary workers, the rental of equipment, the purchase and distribution of supplies, materials and facilities and expenditure of existing funds, and the Board is also empowered to waive any such procedures and formalities.

Article 6. Emergency Management Coordinator: Powers; Duties

Section 601. The Emergency Management Coordinator shall be responsible for the administration, planning, coordination and operation of all emergency preparedness activities in the County. He/she shall maintain liaison with county, State and Federal authorities, and the authorities of adjacent and nearby political subdivisions so as to insure the most effective emergency operations.

Section 602. His/her duties shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

a. Development of the Macomb County Emergency Operations Plan, and any other appropriate disaster or emergency plans, for the immediate use of all of the facilities, equipment, manpower, and other resources of the County for the purpose of minimizing or preventing damage to persons or property; and protecting and restoring to usefulness governmental services and public utilities necessary for the public health, safety and general welfare.

b. Coordinating the recruitment and training of volunteer personnel and agencies to augment the personnel and facilities of the County for emergency purposes.

c. Through public information programs, educating the population as to actions necessary and required for the protection of persons and property in case of a disaster.

d. Conducting practice alerts and exercises to insure the efficient operation of the County's emergency organization and to familiarize residents of the County with emergency regulations, procedures and operations.

e. Coordinating the activity of all other public and private agencies engaged in any emergency or disaster relief programs.

f. Negotiating with owners or persons in control of buildings or other property for the use of such buildings or property for emergency or disaster relief purposes, and designating suitable buildings as public shelters.

g. Establishing and maintaining administrative control over a local radiological defense program, to include emergency preparations for both peacetime radiation incidents and international wartime disasters.

h. Coordinating County emergency management activities with municipalities located therein and adjacent counties.

Article 7. Volunteers: Appointments; Records

Section 701. Each department, commission, board of other agency of County

government may at any time appoint or authorize the appointment of volunteer citizens to augment the personnel of such County department, commission, board or agency in time of emergency. Such individuals shall be enrolled as Emergency Services Volunteers and shall be subject to the rules and regulations set forth by the respective department, commission, board or agency head for such volunteers.

Section 702. The Coordinator may enlist volunteer citizens to form the personnel of an emergency service for which the County has no counterpart, or to temporarily augment personnel of the County engaged in emergency activities. The Coordinator shall maintain formal records of all such volunteers for workman's compensation purposes.

Article 8. Rights of County Employees

Section 801. County employees assigned to duty as a part of the Emergency Management Forces pursuant to the provisions of this resolution shall retain all of the rights, privileges, and immunities of county employees, and shall receive the compensation incident to their employment.

Article 9. No Governmental or Private Liability

Section 901. This resolution is an exercise by the County of its governmental functions for the protection of the public health, safety, and general welfare. As such, neither the County nor agents and representatives of the County, nor any individual, receiver, firm, partnership, corporation, association, nor trustee, nor any of the agents thereof acting in good faith carrying out, complying with, or attempting to comply with this resolution shall be liable for any damage sustained to persons or property as a result of said activity.

Section 902. Any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation grants the county the right to inspect designate and use the whole or any part of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during a disaster or during an authorized practice disaster exercise, shall not be civilly liable for the death of, or injury to, any person on or about such real estate or premises under such license, privilege or any permission, or for loss of, or damage to, the property of such person.

Article 10. Federal Surplus Property

Section 1001. The Emergency Management coordinator is hereby designated as the

person responsible for accepting Federal surplus property with the power and full authority to sign for such surplus property. The Chairperson shall provide a written statement to appropriate Federal or State officials designating the current name of the Coordinator as responsible for complying with the provisions of this article.

Section 1002. The Coordinator is responsible for the accountability and will maintain the necessary records for all surplus property obtained for emergency purposes until relieved from accountability by State and Federal authorities.

Section 1003. The Coordinator is further authorized to direct payment of service charges for surplus property to complete all transactions.

Section 1004. Misappropriation or unauthorized private use of such public property while still accountable is subject to prosecution under Federal and State statute.

Article 11. Severability

Section 1101. Should any section, clause, or provision of this resolution be declared by the courts invalid for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the validity of this resolution as a whole or any part thereof, other than the section, clause or provision so declared to be invalid.

Article 12. Effective Date

Section 1301. This Resolution shall have immediate effect.

The County Agency shall contract for the necessary engineering services to draw plans for the project and shall enter into negotiations with the aforesaid Village for the execution of a contract covering the acquisition, construction and financing of the project by the County Agency for and on behalf of the County of Macomb, with the project to be leased to the Village for operation after construction.

3. The County Agency shall employ the following consultants in connection with the project:

As bond counsel: Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone
Detroit, Michigan

As financial consultant: Bendzinski & Co.
Detroit, Michigan

As engineers: McNamee, Porter, Seely, Inc.
Mt. Clemens, Michigan

4. The said Village shall undertake to provide by contract for the payment of all costs of retiring the necessary financing and shall further undertake to reimburse the County for all expenses incurred in connection with the project should the financing and construction of the project not be completed for any reason whatsoever.

5. This Board hereby estimates the total cost of constructing the improvements to be \$1,170,000, including all engineering fees, financing costs and contingencies, such estimate subject, however, to revision upon submission of final cost estimates or receipt of bids for the project.

6. All agreements between the County Agency and the aforesaid Village shall be subject to final approval and ratification by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Macomb.

7. The County Agency is hereby authorized to notify the Michigan Department of Treasury of the County's intent to issue the bonds described herein, to pay the related fee and to request an order providing an exception for the bonds from prior approval by the Department of Treasury.

8. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same hereby are rescinded.

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO DEFRAY COSTS OF CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE MACOMB COUNTY SEWER SEPARATION SYSTEM (ARMADA SECTION); AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF SUCH IMPROVEMENTS; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE TO SAID CONSTRUCTION AND SAID BONDS.

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the County of Macomb, Michigan, by resolution of its Board of Commissioners, adopted the provisions of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, and pursuant to said resolution the County Public works Commissioner of the County of Macomb as the duly designated agency of the County has constructed and maintained a sewer separation system and related equipment and appurtenances in connection therewith;

AND WHEREAS, to preserve and protect the public health, safety and welfare of the present and future residents of the Village hereafter named, which in turn will be for the benefit of the general health, safety and welfare of the entire County of Macomb, it is necessary to meet an imperative and urgent need for sewer separation services, which said improvements are generally described in the contract hereinafter set forth;

AND WHEREAS, in order to finance costs of said improvements, it is deemed advisable to proceed under the authorization contained in Sections 5a, 5b and 5c of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, and the resolution heretofore referred to;

AND WHEREAS, the County will establish the Macomb County Sewer Separation System (Armada Section) and the district therefor encompassing the proposed improvements under the provision of the aforesaid Act 342;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to said statutory authorization, the County of Macomb, by its County Public Works Commissioner as the duly designated County Agency, and the foresaid Village have executed a contract providing for the construction and financing of such improvements as a part of the Macomb County Sewer Separation System (Armada Section) and for other details in connection with such financing and construction, said contract being as attached hereto in full and made a part of this resolution;

AND WHEREAS, all things necessary to the authorization and issuance of bonds pursuant to the provisions of law, particularly Sections 5a, 5b and 5c of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, have been done, and the County of Macomb is now empowered and desires to authorize the issuance of such bonds.

AND WHEREAS, the bonds herein referred to are expected to be purchased by the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority (the "MMBA") in the State Revolving Fund Program;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF MACOMB

THIS 24TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1991, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. Wherever used in this resolution or in the bonds to be issued hereunder, except where otherwise indicated by the context:

(a) The term "County" shall be construed to mean the County of Macomb, Michigan.

(b) The term "Local Unit" shall be construed to mean the Village of Armada, County of Macomb, Michigan.

(c) The term "Act" shall be construed to mean Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended.

(d) The term "County Agency" shall be construed to mean the Public Works Commissioner of the County.

(e) The term "Project" shall be construed to mean the sewer separation improvements to be acquired and constructed, as referred to in the preamble to this resolution and the contract attached hereto.

(f) The term "Contract" shall be construed to mean the contract, heretofore made and executed between the County, by its duly designated County Agency, and the Local Unit, as set forth in the preamble hereto.

(g) The term "Contractual Payments" shall be construed to mean the installment payments as required to be made by the Local Unit to the County pursuant to the provisions of Section 10 of the Contract and pledged for the payment of principal and interest on the bonds to be issued.

Section 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICT. The Board of Commissioners of the County does hereby approve the establishment of a sewer separation system for the Local Unit in the County, known as MACOMB COUNTY SEWER SEPARATION SYSTEM (ARMADA SECTION) (the "system"), for the separation of combined sewers in the system hereinafter described, together with all necessary and related appurtenances, attachments, works, instrumentalities, rights in land and properties used or useful in connection with the operation of a sewer separation system in the area comprising said system as hereinafter described. the System and the area to be served thereby shall encompass the following territory:

Municipality:

Village of Armada

Area to be served
by the System:

Entire Village water
service area.

Section 3. CONSTRUCTION OF PROJECT. The Project to be located within the Local Unit, as generally described in the Contract and in the maps and plans filed with the County Agency, is hereby approved as a County project to be acquired, constructed, operated and financed under the provisions of the Act.

Section 4. APPROVAL OF PLANS AND ESTIMATES; DETERMINATION OF NECESSITY. The plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the Project preliminarily prepared by the engineers specified in the Contract are hereby accepted and approved, and it is hereby determined to be necessary, for the public health of the County, to acquire, construct and complete said Project, as provided in said plans and specifications, under the supervision and direction of the County Agency.

Section 5. APPROVAL OF CONTRACT. The Contract between the County, by its duly designated County Agency, and the Local Unit, as attached hereto, is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.

Section 6. ESTIMATED COST AND ESTIMATED PERIOD OF USEFULNESS. The total cost of acquiring and constructing said Project, including the payment of incidental expenses specified in Section 6 hereof, which total estimated cost is \$1,170,000, is hereby approved and confirmed, and the estimated period of usefulness of the Project is determined to be not less than forty (40) years.

Section 7. ISSUANCE OF BONDS. For the purpose of paying costs of construction of the Project, including payment of engineering, legal and financing expenses, there be borrowed the sum of One Million One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$1,170,000) and that in evidence thereof there be issued the bonds of the County as hereinafter set forth.

Section 8. BOND TERMS. Said bonds shall be designated MACOMB COUNTY SEWER SEPARATION SYSTEM (ARMADA - SECTION) BONDS (LIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION), the principal of and interest thereon to be payable primarily out of the contractual Payments required to be paid by the Local Unit pursuant to the Contract. Said bonds shall consist of one (1) fully registered bond of the denomination of \$1,170,000, dated as of the date of delivery, and shall be payable to the MMBA as registered holder and shall be payable in principal installments on October 1 of each year as follows:

The bonds are expected to be delivered to the MMBA as initial purchaser thereof, in installments (the "delivery installments") and each delivery installment shall be noted on the registration grid set forth on the bonds. The delivery installments shall be deemed to correspond to the serial principal installments of the bonds in direct chronological order of said serial principal installments.

The serial principal installments of the bonds will each bear interest from the date of delivery of the corresponding delivery installment to the registered holder thereof as shown on the registration grid set forth on the bonds at a rate of two percent (2%) per annum, payable on the first day of April, 1992, and semi-annually thereafter on October 1 and April 1 of each year until maturity of said installment. The bonds shall be issued in fully-registered form and shall not be convertible or exchangeable except as herein provided.

Section 9. EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF BONDS. The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute said bond by means of their facsimile or manual signatures when issued and sold for and on behalf of the County and to imprint or impress the seal of the County thereon.

Section 10. PRIMARY SECURITY FOR BONDS. The bonds and the interest thereon shall be payable primarily from the Contractual Payments received by the County pursuant to the Contract, for the payment of which the Local Unit in the Contract has pledged its full faith and credit pursuant to the provisions of the Act. The Local Unit has covenanted and agreed to levy taxes to the extent necessary to provide funds to meet the Contractual Payments as they become due under the provisions of the Contract, subject to charter, statutory and constitutional limitations. As provided in Section 6, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan, the bonds herein authorized are being issued in anticipation of the Contractual Payments to be made by the Local Unit under the Contract, such Contractual Payments being "contract obligations in anticipation of which bonds are issued" within the purview of said Section of the Constitution.

All of such Contractual Payments are hereby pledged solely and only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds.

Section 11. DEBT RETIREMENT FUND. It shall be the duty of the County Agency, after the adoption of this resolution and the sale of bonds herein authorized, to open a special depository account to be designated DEBT RETIREMENT FUND - MACOMB COUNTY SEWER

SEPARATION SYSTEM (ARMADA SECTION) BONDS (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Debt Retirement Fund"), into which account it shall be the duty of the County Agency to deposit, as received, the Contractual Payments required to be made by the Local Unit pursuant to the Contract, any payments made by the County pursuant to the provisions of Section 12 of this resolution, any advance payments made by the Local Unit, or any additional moneys paid by the Local Unit to be used for purchasing bonds for retirement prior to maturity. The moneys from time to time on hand in said Debt Retirement Fund shall be used solely and only for the payment of the interest of and principal on the bonds herein authorized.

Section 12. SECONDARY SECURITY FOR BONDS. Pursuant to authorization provided in the Act, the full faith and credit of the County is hereby pledged for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on all of said bonds as the same shall become due. If for any reason there are not sufficient funds on hand from the Contractual Payments pledged to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due, as specified herein and in the Contract, upon written notification by the County Agency to the County Treasurer of the County of the amount of such deficiency, and if necessary for such payment, the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the County, subject to statutory and constitutional limitations. If it becomes necessary for the County to so advance such moneys, it shall have such right or rights of reimbursement and any and all remedies therefor as provided by the Act or any other law. The County recognizes and covenants that its full faith and credit pledge herein is a first budget obligation.

Section 13. BOND FORM. The bonds shall be in substantially the following form:

The County of Macomb, State of Michigan (the "Issuer"), for value received, hereby promises to pay to the Registered Owner specified above, or registered assigns, the Principal Amount specified above, in lawful money of the United States of America on the dates and in the principal installment amounts set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof, with interest on said installments from the date each said installment or portion thereof is delivered to the registered owner hereof as set forth on the delivery registration grid hereon until paid at the rate of two percent (2%) per annum, payable on April 1, 1992, and semiannually thereafter, provided that the principal repayments required herein to the registered holder shall not exceed the total of the principal installments set forth on the delivery registration grid hereon from time to time hereafter to acknowledge receipt of payment of the purchase price of this bond up to a total of \$1,170,000. Notwithstanding any other provision of this bond, so long as the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority (the "MMBA") is the owner of this bond, (a) this bond is payable as to principal and interest at the trust office of Michigan National Bank, Grand Rapids, Michigan, or at such other place as shall be designated in writing to the Issuer by the MMBA (the "MMBA's Depository"); (b) the Issuer agrees that it will deposit with the MMBA's Depository payments of the principal of and interest on this bond in immediately available funds at least five business days prior to the date on which any such payment is due whether by maturity or otherwise.

MULLER, CANNON, PADDOCK AND STONE

This bond is a single fully-registered bond representing an entire series of bonds aggregating the principal sum of \$1,170,000. However, should the MMBA transfer this bond, then the MMBA may direct the Issuer to cause fully-registered bonds to be issued in exchange for this bond, denominated in integral multiples of \$5,000, not exceeding for each maturity the aggregate principal amount of such maturity. The replacement bonds shall be dated as of delivery to the original transferee, and numbered in order of registration.

The bonds of this issue are payable primarily from the proceeds of contractual payments to be paid by the Village of Armada, County of Macomb, Michigan, to the Public Works Commissioner of the County of Macomb, Michigan, acting for and on behalf of said County, pursuant to a certain contract dated _____, 1991, between said governmental units, whereby said County Agency, on behalf of the County, is to construct sewer system improvements in said County to service said Village, said improvements being a part of Macomb County Sewer Separation System (Armada Section). By the provisions of said contract and pursuant to the authorization provided by law, the Village has pledged its full faith and credit for the payment of said contractual payments. The County has irrevocably pledged to the payment of this issue of bonds the total contractual payments, which said total payments are established in the amount required to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds of this issue when due. As additional security for the payment of the bonds of this issue, the County, pursuant to the provisions of Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, has pledged its full faith and credit for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest thereon. The full faith and credit pledge of the Village and of the County is a limited tax general obligation of each severally, and each is required to pay its debt service obligations on the bonds as a first budget obligation from its general funds, including the collection of any ad valorem taxes which it is authorized to levy, subject to charter, statutory and constitutional limitations.

This bond is one of a total authorized issue of bonds of even original issue date aggregating the principal sum of \$1,170,000 issued pursuant to a resolution duly adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the County on _____, 1991, and under and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Michigan, including specifically Act 342, Public Acts of Michigan, 1939, as amended, for the purpose of paying costs of constructing sewer separation improvements in said County to service said Village. For a complete statement of the funds from which and the conditions under which this bond is payable, and the general covenants and provisions pursuant to which this bond is issued, reference is made to the above described resolution.

In the event of a default in the payment of principal or interest hereon when due, the amount of such default shall bear interest (the "additional interest") at a rate equal to the rate of interest which is two percent above the MMBA's cost of providing

funds (as determined by the MMBA) to make payment on the bonds of the MMBA, if any, issued to provide funds to purchase this bond but in no event in excess of the maximum rate of interest permitted by law. The additional interest shall continue to accrue until the MMBA has been fully reimbursed for all costs incurred by the MMBA (as determined by the MMBA) as a consequence of the Issuer's default. Such additional interest shall be payable on the interest payment date following demand of the MMBA. In the event that (for reasons other than the default in the payment of any municipal obligation purchased by the MMBA) the investment of amounts in the reserve account established by the MMBA for the bonds, if any, of the MMBA issued to provide funds to purchase this bond, fails to provide sufficient available funds (together with any other funds which may be made available for such purpose) to pay the interest on outstanding bonds of the MMBA issued to fund such account, the Issuer shall and hereby agrees to pay on demand only the Issuer's pro rata share (as determined by the MMBA) of such deficiency as additional interest on this bond.

This bond and the principal installments hereof are not subject of redemption prior to maturity.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required by law precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, and the series of which this is one, having been done and performed in regular and due time and form as required by law.

Section 14. ADDITIONAL BONDS. Nothing contained in this resolution or the Contract shall be construed to prevent the County from issuing additional bonds in accordance with the provisions of the statutes of the State of Michigan for the purpose of financing wastewater facilities authorized by law, but such bonds shall in no way have any lien or be payable out of the Contractual Payments pledged to the payment of the bonds of this authorized issue, unless additional bonds are issued to complete the Project, as authorized by the provisions of the Contract.

Section 15. CONTRACT WITH BONDHOLDERS. The provisions of this resolution, together with the contract attached hereto, shall constitute a contract between the County and the holder or holders of the bonds from time to time, and after the issuance of such bonds, no change, variation or alteration of the provisions of this resolution and the Contract may be made which would lessen the security for the bonds. The provisions of this resolution and the Contract shall be enforceable by appropriate proceedings taken by such holder under the law.

Section 16. COVENANTS OF COUNTY. The County covenants and agrees with the successive holders of the bonds that so long as any of the bonds remain outstanding unpaid as to either principal or interest as follows:

(a) The County and the County Agency will punctually perform all of its obligations and duties under this resolution and the Contract herein set forth, and will collect, segregate and apply the Contractual Payments and other moneys paid by the Local Unit or by the County, in the manner required under this resolution and the Contract.

(b) The County will promptly and punctually perform all of its legal obligations and duties relative to the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds by virtue of the pledge of its full faith and credit for the payment thereof under the terms of this resolution.

(c) The County and the County Agency will apply and use the proceeds of sale of the bonds in the manner required by the provisions of this resolution and the Contract.

(d) The County and the County Agency will maintain and keep proper books of record and account relative to the application of funds for the construction of the Project and the Contractual Payments and other moneys received from the Local Unit or advanced by the County. Not later than three (3) months after the end of

each year, the County shall cause to be prepared a statement, in reasonable detail, sworn to by its chief accounting officer, showing the application of the proceeds of sale of the bonds, the cash receipts from the Local Unit or County during such year and the application thereof, and such other information as may be necessary to enable any taxpayer or any holder or owner of the bonds, or anyone acting in their behalf, to be fully informed as to all matters pertaining to the construction of the Project and application of funds therefor, or for the payment of the bonds during such year. A certified copy of said statement shall be filed with the County Clerk of the County and the Clerk of the Local Unit, and a copy shall also be sent to the manager or managers of the account purchasing the bonds.

(e) The County agrees that it will take or abstain from taking all actions required by the federal Internal Revenue Code and regulations thereunder as may be necessary to retain for the interest on the bonds the exemption from direct federal income taxation, including specifically all actions as required by the Non-Arbitrage and Tax Compliance Certificate and related documents furnished in connection with the bonds.

Section 17. PROCEEDS OF BOND SALE; INVESTMENT. The proceeds of sale of the bonds herein authorized, except a sum equal to the accrued interest and premium, if any, received upon delivery of the bonds, which sum shall be deposited into the Debt Retirement Fund, shall be used by the County solely and only to pay costs of construction of the Project, including all engineering, legal, financing and other expenses incident thereto. Pending utilization of said funds for said purposes, said moneys, as nearly as may be practicable, shall be invested, reinvested and deposited as permitted by Michigan law, which investments and deposits shall mature, or which shall be subject to redemption by the holder thereof at the option of the holder, not later than the respective dates, as estimated by the County Agency, when such moneys will be required to pay costs of construction of the Project. Said investments and deposits shall be selected by the County Agency. Interest realized from such investments or deposits shall be considered as additional moneys for construction. Any surplus construction moneys remaining after completion of the Project shall be used in accordance with the provisions therefor specified in the Contract.

Section 18. DUTIES OF COUNTY AGENCY RE SALE OF BONDS. The County Agency is hereby designated, for and on behalf of the County, to (a) prepare and submit application to the Michigan Department of Treasury for its approval of the issuance of said bonds and the form of notice of sale, as required by law, or alternatively for an order of exception from prior approval, in the latter event together with payment of the required fee; (b) arrange for sale of

the bonds, and (c) to do all other acts and take all other actions and other necessary procedures required to effectuate a sale and delivery of the bonds, including, if appropriate, reducing the amount of bonds sold and/or delivered if the County Agency determines that the full amount thereof is not necessary to complete the Project.

The County hereby authorizes the bonds to be sold to the MMBA, upon arrangements with the MMBA satisfactory to the Board, in an amount equal to the amount and at a net interest rate or cost not more than the rate described in this resolution and at a discount not exceeding 5%, all as shall be approved by the County Agency at the time of sale and pursuant to the terms and provisions further described in this resolution. Any interest on the bonds shall include such additional interest not exceeding the maximum rate permitted by law as may be required by the MMBA, and the bonds shall bear terms as may be required by the MMBA.

The County Agency or the County Treasurer are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Purchase Contract and any other documents as may be required by the MMBA, with such changes and insertions in each such document as may be necessary or desirable, permitted by law, and not materially adverse to the Local Unit and the County.

The provisions of this resolution relating to the terms of the bonds may be changed upon approval of the County Agency if such changes are necessary or convenient to effectuate the issuance of the bonds or to comply with the requirements of the MMBA, and the County Agency and all officers, agents and employees of the County are further authorized to take any action within the terms of this resolution to effectuate such sale to the MMBA.

If in the future the bonds should no longer be held by the MMBA, the County Agency shall take all steps necessary to convert the bonds to registered bonds of the denomination of \$5,000 or multiples of \$5,000 up to the amount of a single principal installment, numbered consecutively in order of authentication, engage a transfer agent for the bonds and otherwise take all actions necessary in connection with such replacement of the bonds.

Section 19. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS REPEALED. All resolutions or orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Section 20. EFFECTIVE DATE OF RESOLUTION. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

WHEREAS, this year marks the fourth annual White Ribbon Against Pornography (WRAP) Campaign, and,

WHEREAS, during Pornography Awareness Week, the citizens of Macomb County are being asked to fly white ribbons, symbolic of the battle for safe and wholesome communities free of obscenity and pornography, and,

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners is in full support to help enforce and change our laws to protect our citizens, especially our children in Macomb County from the harmful effects of this wide-spread problem whether it be from live shows, television, movies, videos, books, magazines or other media, and,

WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon each one of us to fight the illegal pornography industry's invasion of our community with every weapon at our disposal.

WHEREAS, Act. No. 40 of the Public Acts of 1932 as amended entitled "An Act to Provide for the Designation of Depositories of Public Monies; to Prescribe the Effect thereof on the liability for such Deposits; to Suspend the Requirements of Surety Bonds from Depositories of Public Monies; and to repeal all ACTS and parts of ACTS inconsistent with the provisions of this ACT". Provides therein, amongst other things, that the Board of Commissioners shall provide by resolution for the deposit of all public monies, including tax monies, coming into the hands of the County Treasurer, in one or more banks to be designated by said resolution, and in such proportion and manner as may be further provided in said resolution, and,

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Treasurer has requested the adoption of the within resolution, and the repeal of all resolutions inconsistent herewith.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, SPEAKING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF ALL COUNTY CITIZENS AS FOLLOWS:

I

That pursuant to Section 2, of Act 40 of the Public Acts of 1932 as amended, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Macomb hereby designates as authorized depositories of all public monies, including tax monies, coming into the hands of the County of Macomb Treasurer, the following banking or financial institutions;

(To be named at a later time as provided in Paragraph II [a].)

II

Be It Further Resolved by the Macomb County Board of Commissioners that the following rules of procedure and guidelines relative to deposit of public monies by the Macomb County Treasurer are hereby adopted in accordance with Section 2 of Act 40 of the Public Acts 1932 as amended from time to time, and all such deposits of public monies by the County Treasurer shall be conducted and governed hereby:

- a. The Macomb County Treasurer shall recommend a list of banks and financial institutions eligible for deposit of County

public funds. Upon receipt of such list, the Finance Committee shall annually prepare and offer a resolution, in accordance with the foregoing cited statutes, setting forth the approved designated depositors together with guidelines and procedures relative thereto.

- b. The Macomb County Treasurer shall deposit all public funds in the designated banks and financial institutions in accordance with such resolution and in; such manner as to obtain the highest yield therefrom; PROVIDED, such deposits shall be made, at the discretion of the County Treasurer, so that the deposits and maturity dates of investments shall be consistent with the efficient performance of the financial business of the County and permit the timely payment of all County and Public obligations.

- c. It is further directed that in no event shall the total monies on deposit with any bank or financial institution exceed 50% of the capitalization of the individual bank or financial institution.

- d. The County Treasurer shall submit a report once every three months to the Finance Committee. The report shall contain the following information:
 - 1. Names of individual banks and financial institutions in which deposits have been made.

 - 2. The amount of deposit with each bank or financial institution at the beginning and end of the reporting period and average monthly balance.

 - 3. The nature of the deposit or investment, i.e., checking, certificates of deposit, etc.

 - 4. The interest rates payable on each interest bearing deposit or investment (interest rate to be reported as yield if available).

- e. The foregoing provisions are not intended to restrict or

control the County Treasurer in his statutory duties and functions but rather to fulfill the statutory obligation of the County of Macomb relative to the deposit of public monies and to apprise the Board of Commissioners of the status of such deposits upon a continuing basis.

III

Be It Further Resolved that all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are repealed and set aside, and that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption hereof.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County Board of Commissioners to establish a policy to provide for the uniform application of the provision of Public Act 274 of 1990 to allow the transfer of a member's credited service from the Retirement System.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, SPEAKING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF ALL COUNTY CITIZENS AS FOLLOWS:

I

That by These Presents, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners hereby elects to adopt a policy allowing members of the Macomb County Retirement System to transfer their credited service time from said County system to a succeeding reciprocal unit pursuant to the provisions of Act 274 of 1990, and such policies and procedures as may be adopted by this Board.

II

Be It Further Resolved, that every member of the Macomb County Retirement System shall have the opportunity to make application for and to transfer credited service time from the system on an equal basis so long as said applicant complies with the provisions of State law and the policies, rules and guidelines as may be adopted by the Board of Commissioners for the transfer of service time. In no event shall any member of the Retirement System be denied the opportunity or right to transfer said credited service for any reason other than their failure to comply with State law, the County Retirement Ordinance or the Board of Commissioner's policies, rules, and guidelines.

III

Be It Further Resolved, that all said transfers of a member's credited service shall be subject to the approval of the succeeding reciprocal unit and with the provisions of Public Act 274 of 1990.

IV

Be It Further Resolved, that all transfers of a member's credited service must

provide: (1) that all of the members credited service be transferred from the system; (2) that the amount of financial consideration being transferred to the succeeding unit from the County include all of the member's contributions with the balance of monies being paid from the Retirement System's accumulated reserves; (3) that upon completion of the transfer any and all claims of the members to retirement benefits including fringe benefits are extinguished.

FULL FAITH AND CREDIT RESOLUTION
GREEN DRAIN ENCLOSURE BONDS

WHEREAS, Act 40, Public Acts of Michigan, 1956, as amended (the "Drain Code"), authorizes any county to pledge its full faith and credit for the payment of obligations issued thereunder, if the Board of Commissioners of the county has adopted a resolution by two-thirds (2/3) vote of its members-elect to that effect; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to petition filed by the City of Sterling Heights, Macomb County, Michigan, pursuant to Chapter 20 of the Drain Code, with the Public Works Commissioner of the County of Macomb, proceedings have been carried out by the Statutory Drainage Board of the County of Macomb for the financing and designated as GREEN DRAIN ENCLOSURE, said project having been determined to be necessary for the public health; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said proceedings, Special Assessment Roll No. 1 has been prepared and duly confirmed by the Drainage Board in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,910,779, being the amount of the total estimated cost of the project, a portion of which assessments are payable in annual installments over a period of fifteen (15) years, commencing April 1, 1993, by the City of Sterling Heights according to apportionments duly determined by the Drainage Board, as follows:

City of Sterling Heights - 55.73643, said installments bearing interest at such rate of interest as may be necessary to pay interest on obligations payable therefrom, the balance of said installments on said Roll No. 1 assessed against the County of Macomb for highway benefits having been prepaid; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authorization provided in the Drain Code, the Drainage Board, by resolution, has authorized and provided for the issuance of bonds payable from the collection of said special assessments against the City of Sterling Heights on said Roll, said bonds being designated GREEN DRAIN ENCLOSURE DRAINAGE DISTRICT BONDS in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,065,000, dated as of July 1, 1992, bearing interest at a maximum rate of 9% per annum and maturing serially from May 1, 1993 to May 1, 2007, to provide funds to pay costs of the project; and,

WHEREAS, the said drainage project is immediately necessary to protect and preserve the public health, and it is to the best interest of the County of Macomb that the said bonds, in order to be sold at the lowest and most favorable interest cost possible to obtain, be secured by a pledge of the full faith and credit of the County, as authorized by the provisions of said Drain Code:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF MACOMB, MICHIGAN:

1. That pursuant to the authorization provided in the Drain Code the Board of Commissioners of the County of Macomb does hereby irrevocably pledge the full faith and credit of the County of Macomb for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the aforesaid bonds when due, and pursuant to said pledge, in the event that the aforesaid Drainage District shall fail or neglect to pay the aforesaid bonds or interest thereon when due, the amount unpaid shall be promptly advanced from County funds as a first budget obligation, and the County Treasurer is directed to immediately make such advancement to the extent necessary.

2. That in the event that pursuant to said pledge of its full faith and credit the County of Macomb advances out of County funds all of any part of said installments and interest, it shall be the duty of the County Treasurer, for and on behalf of the County of Macomb, to take all actions and proceedings and pursue all remedies permitted or authorized by law for the reimbursement of such sums so paid.

3. The Public Works Commissioner of the County of Macomb is hereby authorized to notify the Michigan Department of Treasury of the County's intent to pledge its full faith and credit as secondary security for the \$1,065,000 Green Drain Enclosure, Drainage District Drainage District Bonds, to pay the related fee and to request an order providing an exception for the bonds from prior approval by the Department of the Treasury.

Turning Point has received funding from Downriver Community Services to provide Health Screening, Substance Abuse screening which includes information and referral linkages.

The funding is an allocation Downriver Community Services receives to serve Macomb County homeless individuals and families through the New Haven Medical Clinic.

Downriver has contracted with Turning Point to provide the above services. Turning Point hires a Health Advocate to carry out the contracted activities and to also schedule appointments at the New Haven Medical Clinic and to coordinate transportation.

Prior to the Homeless Health Care Project, Turning Point relied on local hospital emergency rooms for medical needs of the homeless. Since the contractual relationship with Downriver Community Services has existed trips to local hospital emergency rooms have been reduced by over 90%.

During the past four years Downriver Community Services has continued to reduce funding to Turning Point even though a valuable service has been provided. Funding for 1992/93 is proposed at \$5,000. This means the Homeless Health Advocate position at Turning Point will be eliminated. Although Downriver Community Services proposes to provide the above services themselves they lack access to residents at the Turning Point Shelter.

If funding to Turning Point is not continued at the current level shelter residents will not receive the same level of screening and referral. This may result in a return to the use of hospital emergency rooms which is not an efficient use of public funds.

The services Turning Point provided has assured access of homeless families to medical care through Downriver Community Services Homeless Health Care Project thus the homeless have improved health care.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING POLICY ALLOWING
TRANSFERS OF A MEMBER'S CREDITED SERVICE
FROM A PRECEDING MUNICIPAL RETIREMENT
SYSTEM TO THE MACOMB COUNTY RETIREMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, Public Act 274 of 1990 allows the transfer of a member's credited service from a preceding municipal retirement system to the County Retirement System; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County Board of Commissioners to establish a policy to provide for the uniform application of the provision of Public Act 274 of 1990 and allow the transfer of a member's credited service from a preceding retirement system to the County's Retirement System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MACOMB COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AS FOLLOWS:

I

THAT BY THESE PRESENTS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners hereby elects to adopt a policy allowing members of the Macomb County Retirement System to transfer their credited service time from a preceding retirement system as defined by the Reciprocal Retirement Act (Act 88, P.A. 1961, as amended) to the County's Retirement System pursuant to the provisions of Act 274 of 1990, and such policies and procedures as may be adopted by this Board.

II

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that every member of the Macomb County Retirement System shall have the opportunity to make application for and to transfer credited service time from a preceding reciprocal retirement system to the County's Retirement System on an equal basis so long as said applicant complies with the provisions of State law and the policies, rules and guidelines as may be adopted by the Board of Commissioners for the transfer of service time. In no event shall any member of the Retirement System be denied the opportunity or right to transfer said credited service for any reason other than their failure to comply with State law, the County Retirement Ordinance or the Board of Commissioners' policies, rules and guidelines.

III

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all said transfers of a member's credited service to the Macomb County Employees Retirement System shall be subject to the approval of the preceding reciprocal unit and with the provisions of Public Act 274 of 1990.

IV

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all transfers of a member's credited service from a preceding reciprocal unit to the County's Retirement System shall be contingent upon:

(1) The member paying all of the costs of the transfer including acutarial fees incurred, and,

(2) The member paying to the Retirement System the difference between the increase in the System's accrued liability due to the transfer less the financial consideration transferred to the County's Retirement System from the preceding reciprocal unit as required under Section 6 of the Reciprocal Retirement Act. The increase in the System's accrued liability due to the transfer shall be calculated by the actuary's calculation of the System's accrued liability after the transfer less the System's accrued liability before the transfer.

(3) If the member is transferring two years or less service, the payment as described in paragraph (2) above shall be paid in full within three years of the date of the transfer. If the member is transferring more than two years of service, the payment as described in paragraph (2) above shall be paid in full within five years of the date of the transfer. In any case, payment of the full amount shall be paid at least sixty days prior to the member retiring from the County or the Road Commission. In the event that the member shall fail to pay said monies as required, then in that event, the transfer shall be null and void, and the member shall not receive any creditd service to the Macomb County Employees Retirement System for service rendered in the preceding reciprocal unit except as otherwise provided by law.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING SALARIES AND COMPENSATION IN LIEU OF FEES OF CERTAIN ELECTED AND NON-ELECTED COUNTY OFFICERS AND OFFICIALS AND PROVIDING FOR COUNTY SUPPLEMENTARY PAY BENEFITS FOR CIRCUIT COURT, PROBATE COURT AND CERTAIN DISTRICT COURT JUDGES, AND TO PROVIDE PAYMENT OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND

WHEREAS, by virtue of existing laws, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners is authorized and empowered to fix annual salaries and other compensation in lieu of all statutory fees, of certain elected and non-elected County officers and officials, and to supplement state salaries of Circuit Court, Probate Court and certain District Court judges, and to provide fringe benefits for all of the foregoing:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MACOMB COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AS FOLLOWS:

A. To the extent authorized by law, the following elected and non-elected County officers and officials are hereby granted for the calendar years 1993 and 1994, the following percentage increases in salary: For 1993, two (2.00%) percent, and for 1994, two (2.0%) percent. The officers and/or officials and their respective salaries are as follows:

B. That all of the foregoing County officials and/or officers, unless otherwise provided herein, are awarded and entitled to receive all fringe benefits granted to all non-union County employees, as legally constituted and authorized by law, including cost of living allowance (COLA) based on two thousand eighty (2,080) hours per annum, provided that none of the fringe benefits, including COLA, shall exceed total compensation as currently provided by law.

C. That the Road Commissioners shall receive the same fringe benefits as other non-union Road Commission employees, including cost of living allowance at the current level of \$5.42 per hour, based on two thousand eighty (2,080) hours per annum; provided, that none of these fringe benefits, including COLA, shall exceed total compensation as currently provided by law, and further provided that said Road Commission compensation shall be paid from County Road funds as provided by law.

D. In addition to the increase in annual compensation hereinabove set forth, a

member of the County Board of Commissioners shall continue to receive per diem compensation of \$35.00 for attending each meeting of the County Board of Commissioners, or for attending to any business for and on behalf of the County Board of Commissioners at the Board's request, provided no member shall be paid more than one per diem per day, nor more than 125 per diems per year. PROVIDED, however, that the duly elected Chairperson of the Macomb County Board of Commissioners shall receive an annual salary of \$46,199 in 1993 and \$47,123 in 1994. The Chairperson shall receive no per diem compensation for attending meetings of the Board of Commissioners or for attending to any business for or on behalf of the Board of Commissioners.

E. WHEREAS, the statutes of the State of Michigan provide that the total annualized salary, including cost of living allowance for a Circuit Court Judge shall not exceed Ninety-two (92) percent of the salary of a Justice of the Supreme Court, the total annualized salary, including cost of living allowances, for a Probate Court Judge and a District Court Judge shall not exceed eighty eight (88) percent of the salary of a Justice of the Supreme Court and, whereas, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners did determine to maintain Judges in conformity with said statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to maintain Probate Judges, District Court Judges and Circuit Court Judges in line with one another and in conformity with Michigan statutes for the years 1993 and 1994:

1. Circuit Court Judges shall receive a total annualized salary equal to ninety-two (92) percent of the salary of a Justice of the Supreme Court; and

2. Probate Court Judges and District Court Judges of the 42nd District shall receive a total annualized salary equal to eighty-eight (88) percent of the salary of a Justice of the Supreme Court.

F. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each of said Judges of the Circuit Court, Probate Court and District Court be and hereby are awarded and entitled to receive, with the exception of that benefit known as the cost of living allowance (COLA), all fringe benefits granted to all non-union County employees, as legally constituted and authorized by law.

G. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary herein established for the County Sheriff is full compensation for overseeing the inmate food program as well as the performance of statutory duties and that the Sheriff shall receive the same fringe benefits as all other law enforcement members of the Sheriff's Department.

H. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all fees collected by County elected officials or their deputies or department employees be turned over to the County Treasurer for deposit in the general fund of the County of Macomb.

I. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing salaries, compensation, and other benefits are hereby approved for payment out of the general funds of the County of Macomb unless otherwise provided by law.
