A Resolution Calling Special Millage Election For Public Transportation Purposes

Whereas, The County of Macomb (the "County") is designated by law as a member of the Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation ("SMART") established pursuant to Act 204, Public Acts of Michigan, 1967, as amended (the "Act"); and

Whereas, SMART is authorized by the Act to finance transportation facilities by grants or contributions from governmental units and other public sources; and

Whereas, on March 6, 1995, the Board of Directors of SMART took action to cease operations of the suburban bus system as of June 1, 1995, because the agency has run out of money; and

Whereas, the loss of SMART services would cause the elimination of 10,000 elderly and handicapped trips a week, confining many of these people to their home; and

Whereas, the discontinuance of SMART's linehaul service will cause thousands of working people to join the unemployment rolls as well as significantly impair business growth in the suburban communities; and

Whereas, SMART has determined the best course of action for service levels in each County is for each County to decide those actions necessary to allow SMART to continue all levels of service in their County; and

Whereas, the Act specifically authorizes all counties to assist, cooperate with, and contribute services, money or property in aid of SMART and its purposes; and

Whereas, Act 156, Public Acts of Michigan, 1851, as amended, authorizes the County Board of Commissioners to raise by tax upon the County those funds authorized by law and to direct and provide for the raising of money which is necessary to defray the current expenses and charges of the County and the necessary charges incident to arising from the execution of the Board's lawful authority; and

Whereas, in order to maintain public transportation services within the County, SMART has required action by Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties to seek voter approval of a source of funding for public transportation services within the respective counties and to agree to enter into a interlocal agreement with SMART relative to the administration of public transportation services within the region and the guarantees of service to each county making a contribution; and

Whereas, the County desires to seek the authorization of its electorate to increase the total tax rate limitation, as provided for by Section 6 of Article 9 of the State Constitution of 1963, for the purpose of making contributions in aid of SMART and its purposes;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved:

- 1. That in order to allow for more local participation and responsibility in public transportation matters, one member on the SMART Board of Directors, or its successor, shall be a person nominated by the Mayors, Supervisors and Presidents of the majority of the cities, townships and villages in Macomb County; and
- 2. That the County Board of Commissioners hereby calls a special election of the qualified electors of the County of Macomb for May 23, 1995 on the proposition of increasing the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the County of Macomb by 0.33 mill for the years of 1995 to 1997, inclusive, for the purposes of making contributions in aid of SMART and its purposes for the elderly, handicapped and general public of the County of Macomb; and

3. That the proposition to be submitted at the special election shall be stated on a separate ballot, or as a separate proposition on voting machine, in substantially the following form:

Macomb County Public Transportation Millage Proposal

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed in the County of Macomb be increased by 33 cents (\$0.33) per thousand dollars (\$1,000) (0.33 mill) of the taxable value on all taxable property in the County for a period of three (3) years, 1995 to 1997, inclusive, for the purpose of making contributions in aid of SMART and its purposes for the elderly, handicapped and general public of the County of Macomb. It is estimated that the levy of 0.33 mill in 1995 would raise approximately \$4.8 million dollars in the first calendar year of the levy.

- 4. That the Chairperson of the Board of commissioners is hereby authorized and directed to request the Macomb County Election Scheduling Committee for approval of the date of the special election and to do all things necessary for the special elections as are required by law of the County to be done; and
- 5. That the Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an interlocal agreement in a form approved by the County Corporation Counsel with SMART, the Charter County of Wayne and the County of Oakland (or any public transportation authority created by Wayne or Oakland County) providing for the reimbursement of the costs of the special election called by this resolution, whether or not the proposition is approved by the voters, and for the contribution of any revenues received from the levy of the proposed 0.33 mills; and
- 6. That the County Clerk is directed to do all things and provide all supplies necessary for the special election, as required by law to be done; and
 - 7. That this Resolution shall take immediate effect.

Commissioner Anthony E. Block, On Behalf Of The Entire Board of Commissioners, Offers The Following Resolution:

Whereas, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners has maintained a close and productive relationship with the Area Agency on Aging 1-B (AAA 1-B) over the past twenty years to assure the development of services and programs which are responsive to the needs of the county's 1222,000 older adults and supports their independence in the least restrictive setting; and,

Whereas, Macomb County government and service providers were instrumental in 1987 in securing state funds for AAA 1-B to establish a Community Care Management program targeted at the most frail elderly who are assessed, and services arranged according to a specific care plan; and

Whereas, the Michigan Department of Social Services (DSS) and the Office of Services to the Aging (OSA) secured a Home and Community Based Medicaid Waiver from the Health Care Finance Administration (HCFA) which can enable a Community Care Management program to significantly expand its ability to serve many more fail elderly, as well as disabled persons over the age of 18, by using Medicaid resources to purchase up to fourteen essential services: and

Whereas, the Medicaid Waiver program has been particularly successful in reaching older adults and the disabled who otherwise would not have access to in-home services because of their low income and asset levels, their frailty, and their lack of family support systems; and

Whereas, only 14 Michigan counties have thus far been selected by DSS and OSA to implement the Medicaid Waiver during the first phase of the demonstration program, and unfortunately Macomb County has yet to be selected though qualified and ready to add the Waiver program; and

Whereas, DSS and OSA have received HCFA approval of their five year plan to expand the Medicaid Waiver on a phased in basis to other counties in Michigan; and

Whereas, extension of the Medicaid Waiver program to Macomb County could reach more than 7,1000 elderly residents of Macomb County who have incomes below 100% of the poverty level, and another 17,400 elderly residents whose incomes fall below 150% of the poverty level; and

Whereas, the increase in administrative costs of managing three PSA's instead of one will negatively impact the funding distribution formulas for every other AAA in Michigan and whereby this action has financially benefitted the five counties of Region 3 at the expense of the other 78 counties; and

Whereas, the other 13 AAA's in the state, including Macomb's Region 1-B, are losing \$129,000 in service dollars, and \$377,000 in Administrative Funds for a total of \$405,000 as a result of adding two PSA's under the current formulas; and
