Economic Planning Director Patrick Meagher provided more information on the ordinance for Caregivers only. Clerk Babinski posed the question on the effect on current caregivers. Attorney Bob Seibert informed the Board that the current caregivers registered with the Township would be legal non-

Supervisor Previti commented that the lower pay is due to trustees having higher benefit with 15% to 401k and life insurance. Treasurer Nicley asked why the pay raises were not brought up during budget sessions.
