King, Clerk of the House of Representatives, hereby certify that the following is a true copy of the proceedings had by the Legislature in joint convention, held in the Hall of the House of Representatives at Lansing, Tuesday, April 18, 1911, relative to the recount for Circuit Judge held in the County of Macomb pursuant to a concurrent resolution adopted by the Legislature, and that a majority of the Senate and the House of Representatives in joint convention, did ratify and confirm the action of said Legislative Committee and find and declare that in the County of Macomb, James G. Tucker was duly elected to the office of Circuit Judge of the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit, comprising the County of Macomb, at the election held on April 3rd, A.D, 1911, for the full term in said Circuit.

Mr. Perry moved that the Speaker appoint a committee of three to inform the Senate that the House was ready to meet the Senate in joint convention. The motion prevailed.

The Speaker appointed as such committee Messrs. Perry, Mc Eachern and Raudabaugh.

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The Sergeant - at-Arms announced the committee of the House appointed to notify the Senate that it was ready to meet in joint convention.

The committee, through its chairman, Mr. Perry, reported that it had performed the duty assigned it, and was discharged.

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The Sergeant-at Arms announced the Lieutenant Governor and members of the Senate, who were admitted and conducted to seats.

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Joint Convention.

The joint convention was called to order by the President of the joint convention, Hon. John Q. Ross, President of the Senate.

The roll of the Senate was called by the Secretary, who announced that a quorum of the Senate was present.

The roll of the House was called by the Clerk, who announced that a quorum of the House was present.

The President announced that the House and Senate had met in joint convention to receive the reports of the special committees appointed to recount the votes cast at the judicial elections held in Wayne and

Macomb counties.

The special committee appointed to recount the votes cast for the office of circuit judge in the county of Macomb, by Senator Cartier, chairman, submitted the following report;

The special committee appointed by the Senate to act with a like committee of the House to investigate and recount the votes cast at the Judicial Election held in the county of Macomb on April 3rd, 1911, submits the following report;

The special joint committee, consisting of Senators Cartier and Taylor on the part of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate and Representatives Woodruff, Straight and Raudabaugh appointed by the Speaker of the House under Senate concurrent resolution NO. 78 in which the House of Representatives concurred to recount the votes cast for circuit judge to fill vacancy also for full term at the election held in the county of Macomb and State of Michigan, on the 3rd day of April, A.D. 1911, reports that it has made such recount in all the precincts of said county, and upon such recount in such county it finds as follows;

1. That petitioner James G. Tucker waived his right to a recount of the votes cast for the office of circuit judge to fill vacancy on the 3rd day of April, A.D. 1911;
2. That upon the recount of all the votes in all the voting precincts in the county of Macomb cast for the office of circuit judge for full term on the 3rd day of April, 1911, the committee finds that Henry J. Mc Kay received three thousand three hundred twenty three (3,323) votes and that James G. Tucker received three thousand three hundred forty-nine (3,349) votes.
3. The committee does further find and report that James G. Tucker has received the highest number of votes cast at said election for the office of circuit judge for full term and is duly elected to the office of circuit judge of the county of Macomb at said election held on the 3rd day of April, A. D. 1911, for the full term, in said county and state.
4. We recommend that the adoption of this report shall not be construed as being prejudicial to the rights of Henry J. Mc Kay to have his title to the office of circuit judge for the full term litigated in the courts.

We<sup>do</sup> further recommend that the committee be discharged.
